## Floyd County Tax Payers NOTICE

This is to remind you that the law provides that taxes

due County and State for 1932 and all previous years draw only 6 per cent penalty if paid by June 30, 1934, but if not paid by that time, they will draw 10 per cent penalty and 6 per cent intereit from date they became delinquent.

Example: $\$ 100.00$ due in 1924 can be paid for $\$ 106$. 00 on or before June 30, 1934. If not paid by that date. $\$ 470.00$ will be due on the same amount. This does not take into consideration the statutory cost. This applies to all Counhies in Texas, and if you owe any such taxes
moneg. by paying the same by June 30, 1934.
