of the property. If a home owner for instance, has \$2,000 he probably will be able to borrow an additional \$8,000 to build a \$10, 000 home because the \$8;000 or 80 per cent of the appraisal will

Here again the government ends no money. It simply supervises a mutual insurance fund which will be built up by payments of the home owner, probably amounting to 1 per cent a year, is addition to his payments for interest and for reducing the amount of the loan

The procedure necessary for these loans is much more involved them in the cast of modernization and in all likelihood this phase of the program probably will not get under way for perhaps 60 days.

Interest Is Reduced A third feature of the program

will permit persons now owning homes to refinance their existing mortgages up to 70 per cent of the appraised value For instance, if a home owner

has paid up 30 per cent of the value of his home, he may finance the remaining 70 per cent, in an insured mortgage, similar to that given in the case of a new home.

This procedure will make it posrible for the home owner to get a long term lean in place of his ex isting first and second mortgages which usually are supported to be paid off in full in from three to five years.

In the case of both new and old Time homes the insured mortgage will be paid off in up to 20 years. In both cases the interest rate will be materially reduced from what has been customary in the past.


