In 1913 Beatrix met and eventually married William
Heelis, a country Heelis, a country lawyer.
Theirs was a very happy marriage.
The earnings from th Peter Rabbit books amounted to a pretty penny. So Beatrix
Potter, now Mrs. Heelis, bought a country house and became a devoted sheep
breeder. She also was a hard working community leader.
This left no time for her writing and illustrating. In her later years she wrote
several other children's books. However, her main
interest was her husband and her sheep. She passed away
