

HOW COTTON TAGS MAY BE SOLD

Cotton producers who have sur plus cotton certificates may dis pose of them through the national sale pool at 5 cents per pound by taking them to the county agent's office and signing pool agree ments. Or; producers with sur plus certificates may sell to an other producer who needs certificates for ginning at 5 cents per pound. The buyer and seller are requires to sign sale and trans fere agreements.

Producers are cautioned against unscruplous trading in cotton tax exemption certificates as under the law such certificates are not to be traded, swapped or hypothecated for profit.

All sales and transfers of cotton certificates must be recorded in the county agent's office in which they originated; otherwise, trans ferers would not be legal.

In 1934 the government sold all certificates pooled at 4 cents per pound. This year the price is 5 cents per pound and the de partment is calling for surplus certificates. Producers should not remov

any portion of the certificates from the cover unless removed to apply on cotton ginned.

Prices of cotton certificates without heading or name cannot be pooled for sale or legally transferred.




