

DRIVERS' LICENSE LAW TO BECOME EFFECTIVE ON APRIL 1st, 1936

The driver's license law wil become operative April 1, 1936 and will mark the State's first effort in that field. The law was pushed through the Legislature with great difficulty despite growing alarm.

Sponsors of the law who vitnessed the Governor's signature, said it was not as strong as they wanted and that they would attempt to add teeth at the sub-sequent session.

License would be supplied without cost by the State but pos-session would be mandatory. Drivers would be suspended automatically on conviction for:

1. Neglegent homicide real

ing from use of a motor vehicle.

2. Driving while intoxicated. 3. Use of an automobile in

4. Failure to stop and render

Two convictions within one year for violating traffic laws.

The initial suspension would be for six months with subsquent olations punishable by suspension for one year.
