'Mobile' changes dropped

At their Dec. 13 meeting, the members of the Dimmitt Zoning Board voted to recommend to the city not to expand the present zones where mobile homes are allowed in the city

"The main reason we came to this decision is that we did not have what we felt was enough favorable comment to go ahead with the proposal," said zoning chairman Roger Malone. "However, we did have plenty of negative comment.'

Malone stated that if enough people had come forward saying that they felt the additional zoning was needed, the board may have continued to consider the matter.

"The people should provide the initiative for changes, not us. It should be a result of public demand," Malone said. He added that the board can take up the matter again at a later date if the need arises.

The board also discussed needed revisions in the present city code governing mobile homes and their placement.

The state's updated definition of a mobile home was adopted by the board. Anything eight feet wide or wider and 40 feet long or longer is classed as a mobile home. Anything smaller than these dimensions could be pulled by a car and would be classed as a travel trailer.

Board members will present recommended changes in the city code at their next meting Dec. 27 at 7 p.m. in the city hall meeting room.

I had regained p.m. consciousness and realized something was wrong. I found my husband in the living room; he was unable to move and was cold to the touch. I knew I had to get an ambulance.

I couldn't see to dial, and finally dialed the operator. Frances Anes answered. She immediately alerted her service manager, Tomi Poteet, and operator Betty Reyes. They connected me with the hospital and I tried to give them the necessary information.

We live in the country, about eight miles from the hospital. I was so disoriented couldn't tell them where we live. Frances asked who my friends were. The three operators called friends, asking for information or asking them to talk with me. Tomi Poteet called the Sheriff's Office and asked if they knew where we lived. Highway Patrolman C. D. Fitzgearld, an old friend, said he knew. D. and Sheriff Lonny Rhynes led the ambulance to our home. This took 15 to 20 minutes, and the operator kept me talking during this time. They also called my friend, Kathy Thomas, and she kept encouraging me.

When help arrived, C. D. had to pry the phone - my lifeline - from my hand. The ambulance attendants loaded my husband first, and the nurses, Lee Norris and Debbie Alexander, loaded me. Marshall Young drove the ambulance.

Dr. B. D. Murphy met us at the hospital, and diagnosed our problem right away as carbon monoxide poisoning. Later, tests at our home showed a dangerously high carbon monoxide level, and the problem was traced to the floor furnace.

My husband was very ill, and I was very weak and terribly disoriented when I called the Dimmitt operators. We could not have lived another hour without help. Frances Anes, Tomi Poteet and Betty Reyes saved our lives.







The selection of the windbreak seedlings this year will include Pine, Spruce, Cedar, Fir, Juniper, Lilac, Plum, Russian olive, Willow, Elm, Honeysuckle, Nanking cherry and several species that adapt well to this area.

Bare root seedlings contain 50 trees in each package; they are covered with heavy paper and the roots have peat moss around them. The potted orders come in two inch pots with a minimum of 30 seedlings per order.

This year the Running Water District will also be ordering Pecan trees for the people who wish to plant pecans.

Two varieties of pecans will be available, Wichita and Western Schley. These trees are three years old and will cost more than the windbreak seedlings.

For further information or to place your order, the Running Water District will be selling the trees through the Soil Conservation Service office at 3rd and Bedford, phone 647-4324.





Fishing license

Many out-of-state sport fishermen have asked the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department whether they are required to purchase a nonresident fishing license if they are under 17 or 65 years of age or older.

those age categories, he or she need not purchase a fishing license.

Officials said Texas grants THE REAL PROPERTY AND THE PROPERTY AND such exemptions only to residents of states which offer a similar exemption to Texans fishing in their states.

All other nonresident fishermen regardless of age must purchase a \$15 nonresident fishing license or a temporary five-day nonresident fishing license for \$4.50. Texas also has special agreements with Oklahoma and Louisiana on license requirements for fishing border reservoirs. The agreement with Louisiana allows resident sport fishermen of either state who are properly licensed or exempt because of age to fish common boundary lakes and rivers between the two states. A special Lake Texoma license allows its holder to



Some toys can be hazardous

In the Christmas shopping season, many shoppers will be searching high and low for just the right toys that they hope will light up the eyes of their youngsters on Christmas to Prevent Blindness urges shoppers to use common sense in selecting gifts for the Some types of toys can pose serious injury hazards to children, and particularly to

the young eyes they are intended to light up. Prevent Blindness reports that over 4,200 Americans ended up in hospital emergency rooms last year as a result of toy-related eye injuries and that nearly 70% of the victims were under the age of fifteen.

'Most of the injuries were caused by commonly available toys," said Dr. Avery Rush, medical advisor for the Panhandle Branch of TSPB. These include toy guns, projectile toys, self-propelled and flying toys, slingshots, and even such relatively 'safe' toys as dolls and stuffed

Particularly alarming,

according to Rush, is the fact that over half of these injuries were caused by bows and arrows, BB guns, pellet guns and other air, gas, or spring operated guns. "Weapons such as these, when handled as toys, can obviously be extremely dangerous," Rush said.

"There are two prime safety factors that should be considered in selecting toys," Rush continued. "First, is the toy appropriate for the child's age? And second, how much adult supervision will be required, and available, when the child uses the toy? It is also very important that a child be instructed on how to use the toy properly and

Prevent Blindness offers the following suggestions to help shoppers choose safe toys for their youngsters this holiday season:

-Look for toys made from shatter proof and flame resistant materials.

-Avoid toys with sharp edges, points, nails, or screws that are exposed or can be easily exposed.

-Check for rigid interior


frames or springs that can easily puncture soft outside fabric or plastic coverings.

-Remember that all projectile, flying, and selfpropelled toys can be dangerous.

-Be sure to consider the child's age and physical coordination when selecting toys.

Rush concluded by saying, 'A little forethought and good judgement can help make this a safer and happier holiday for all our young Texans.
