MADE HOMELESS SUNDAY

CORPUS CHRISTI, Sept. 16.—The death toll in Sunday's storm will reach between 75 and 100 in Corpus Christi and surrounding towns along the coast, according to an estimate made today by City Health Officer

One hundred and seventy-five refugees were rescued at Odom after they were carried across Nueces bay on wreckage. All of them suffered terribly.

A military relief train from Brownsville, with 5,000 rations and 1,000 beds, arrived early today. Another relief train is at Kingsville and others are expected to follow to the stricken districts.

A launch has been sent to Rockport and Port Aransas in an effort to learn the exact situation of those isolated cities.

CORPUS CHRISTI, Sept. 16-Volunteers today began the arduous work of clearing the streets of wreckage and the removal of the debris will take some time, as houseboats, fishing craft and flotsam of every description is piled high on all of the main thoroughfares of the city.

Especially is this true of the North Beach district. the city's bathing and pleasure district. There the United States marine hospital and one large residence are left standing.

With troops patrolling the main streets and relief trains headed this way, Corpus Christi is slowly emerging from the wreckage caused by the gulf hurricane, which struck the city early Sunday morning, bringing death to an unknown 'number of persons and doing property damage which will run into millions.

estimate of the fatalities.

Fifteen Drills in Pecos River Fields

PECOS, Sept. 16 .- The Santa Fe railway has completed its side track to the Laura weil of the Sunshine com-pany and that company has placed an additional boiler at its plant so that continuous work of drilling will not be interferred with by cleaning out boilers. It is said this company will continue the present well to the deep sands, and will drill several to the stratum in which oil was discovered in the first well.




