## Top List Of Food-a-Plenty

COLLEGE STATION—A record turkey crop is expected this fall . . . about 10 million head more than a year ago.

Heaviest increases in farm marketings over a year ago are due in September, placing turkeys at the top of the U. S. department of agriculture's plentiful foods list for the month.

Rice is another top feature on the list. While this year's crop is estimated to be about 13 per cent less than last, carryover supplies are still heavy.

With the drought forcing more cattle to market than last fall, beef also makes the September plentiful list. Since most of the cattle are off grass, supplies of intermediate and lower grades of beef will be especially heavy.

Good catches of tuna coupled with a heavy carryover from last year have put canned tuna in oil on the list.

Too, broilers and fryers, milk and other dairy products, fresh Bartlett pears, summer vegetables and peanut butter complete the list.

## Sea Turtles Get Reprieve

ROCKPORT — The publicized plight of the comparatively rare green sea turtles has resulted in two of the reptilian giants being turned into the local marine laboratory of the Game and Fish commission, along with a batch of eggs now under experimental incubation.

The director of coastal fisheries said the two big specimens receive doubtlessly would have been dispatched had not the plea for sparing the green turtles been relayed by the news media.

Patricia Pew, wildlife biologist in charge of special lab projects, said the two live turtles will either be tagged and released or turned over to public zoos in the larger cities. The lab's tank exhibit already includes a green sea turtle.

"The idea is to locate these rare reptiles where they will do the most good for conservation," said the Director. "We feel that publicized emphasis on the extinction facing species such as the whooping crane and the green sea turtle helps the public understand the pinch on wildlife restoration generally."

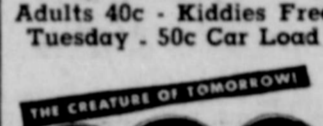
