

#### Far-Reaching Highway Improvement Plans for West Texas



Sketch shows proposed improvements and extension of State Highway No. 199 from Seymour (its present term-inus) northwestward through Crowell, Paducah, Turkey, Quitaque, Silverton, Tulia, and Dimmitt to Bovina on U. S. High-way 60, just east of the Texas-New Mexico border. Heavy line from Fort Worth to Seymour indicates present State Highway 199. Broken line shows sections between Seymour and Crowell and between Paducah and Turkey which lack construction, and when completed, will shorten the distance into Fort Worth westward from Crowell along U.S. 70 through Paducah, Matador, Floydada, Plainview and points west by 17 miles, and by 32 miles from Turkey, Quitaque, Silverton Tulia Dimmitt Canvon and Amarillo. 




