In the Gregorian calendar this date falls on March 21.

The method of calculating the full moon is fixed on ancient procedures, and while modern astronomers do not always agree w i t h these conclusions, the has prevailed down through the centuries.

Under this rule the latest date on which Easter can possibly fall is April 25, which happened in 1943 but won't happen again until 2038. This Easter, being the 21st, is therefore within four days of






