

What A Bill THAT Was!!

This coming May 10 has been declared, more or less ficticiously, National Tax Freedom Holiday. Statisticians have figured that it has taken the average tax payer all of January, February, March, April. and up to the 10th of May, to earn enough money to pay his tax bill for 1957. And after giving the government the first $4^{1}/_{2}$ months of his pay, he can now keep the other $7^{1}/_{2}$ months for himself and his family. However, unless the \$72 Billion Federal Budget is trimmed for 1958, he will have to shell out a lot more of his pay than he did in 1957.

Counting all the hidden taxes, it could conceivably take at least half of his annual income to pay his tax bill in 1958. And this is just the average man. Larger earners are allowed to keep hardly anything at
