(An Editorial to the Business Men of Dimmitt)
There's a big program ahead for us during the coming year of 1930. The future growth and progress of this city, in every way---Religiously,, Agriculturally, Commercially, and Socially. depends wholly upon the cooperation---teamwork, of the business men of the city.
