NO WILL? WHO INHERITS PROPERTY?

What will happen if with should die without executing a leg ty in accordance with your wishes

When a deceased has no will, o dies "intentate" as the law call t, the property of that person i cases this may be the way you yourself would divide it-but in many cases it is not.

The provision of the law con 'Abandon hapt, all ye who enter and Jo'mes was, great all-round cerning the distribution of the pro perty of a person who dies withou a will are rather complicated, and all of the possibilities cannot be

covered by a general statement. . There are different rules for real estate and for personal prop erty, for community property and for seperate property, for homesstead property, and for all of the many possible combinations of surviving relatives. Each situation must be carefully studied to determine the correct distribution of the property.

For example, here is a general idea of how the community prop erty which you and your apous have accumulated will be divided if you do not make a will prior to your death

If your husband or wife survives and there are no children, the sur viving spouse receives all of the

If, in addition, there are surviving children or descendants of deone-half of the property, while the surviving spouse would receive the other one-half.


Of course, grandchildren do not hare in the estate unless their parent who would inherit is deceaed, And when desendants of previously deceased children do inhe it, they receive only the portion hat the child would have receiv ed, regardless of the number of

An odd note, perhaps, is that the surviving spouse already owns one-half of the community estate for to your death, and the law dds nothing to this share where here are children surving.

When there are only children nd their descendants surviving, they divide the entire community sstate between them.




