The WMU Watchword for the year was said in unison. Mrs. Verna Hartsfield led a prayer for the missionaries on the prayer list for the day.

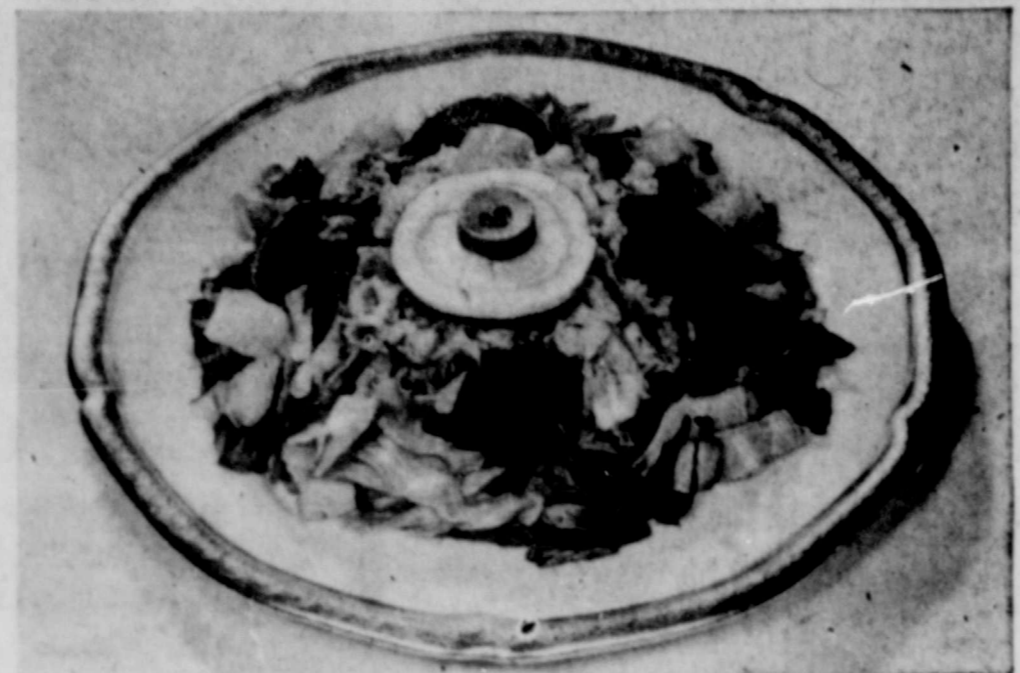
Mrs. F. E. Caraway taught the second chapter of the book, "God's Wealth and Ours." Mrs. R. B. Needham led the closing prayer.

Kippers Are Mixed in Lenten Luncheon Salad



Norway salad, featuring kippers and beets, makes a substantial main course for a Lenten lunch.

FOR a Lenten luncheon combine kippers, beets and other salad ingredients and top with hard-cooked egg. This salad makes a substantial main dish. Beet and Kipper Luncheon Salad (4-5 servings) BY DOROTHY MADDOX Refrigerator for 2 hours. In separate bowl combine cream, mayonnaise, lemon juice, salt and pepper. Peel and cube apple and add immediately to sour cream mixture. Add celery, onion and flaked kippers. Chill. On each plate make a bed of lettuce. Place 4 beets on the lettuce and spoon the kipper mixture on top. Garnish with slice of hard-cooked egg topped with slice of stuffed olive. Sardine and Celery Salad (4-5 servings) One (3 1/2-ounce) can Norway sardines, 1 teaspoon lemon juice, 1/4 cup mayonnaise, 2 hard-cooked eggs, sliced, 1 cup finely chopped celery, 1 cup drained cooked or canned peas, 1 tablespoon finely chopped onion, crisp lettuce leaves, 1 tomato sliced, salt and pepper to taste, parsley. Drain sardines, reserving half for use later. Mash first half. Add lemon juice and mayonnaise. Add celery, onion and peas, season, and toss all together lightly. Arrange in mounds on lettuce leaves. Garnish with egg slices, tomato slices and parsley. Top with remaining whole sardines. Chill. Serve with mayonnaise or salad dressing on the side.

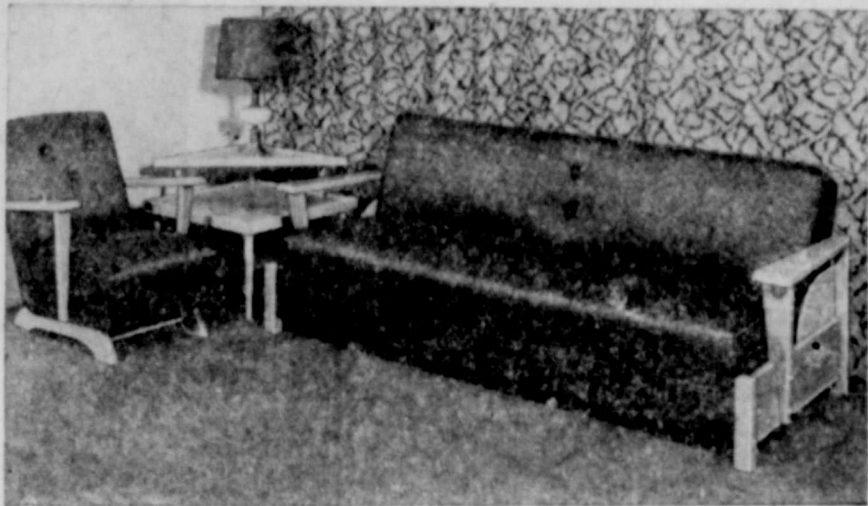

Washington, D. C.—The Executive Department of the Government is finally becoming worried about foreign oil imports. Their worry may not be the same as ours from oil producing areas, but we hope it will result in doing something about it. The Administration has been given the power to limit oil imports under Section 7 of the 1955 Reciprocal Trade Act. The President appointed a committee to study the question and report facts which it found. The committee found that imports were excessive and instituted a system of voluntary controls. This simply means that they have asked the major oil importing companies to cut back on the imports. It has not worked very well. There is now legislation that the President may invoke mandatory controls, and if this is the decision, the action should be coming right away. The Reciprocal Trade Agreements are up in the Congress for renewal, and the Administration is asking for extension of five years. The legislation is in considerable trouble. This may be one good reason why the Administration may now impose mandatory controls on imports. The Executive does not want restrictive quotas written into the Law and hence may take this action for which authority is already granted. It is my feeling that mandatory controls should be written into the extension of the Reciprocal Trade Agreements, regardless of whether the Administration acts or not. Unless we do so, controls may be removed from imports a few months after the present Law is extended, and we would be back where we started. This has been my opinion since 1949, when I first introduced legislation to hold foreign oil imports to 5 per cent of domestic consumption, and another bill in 1950 to hold imports to 10 per cent of domestic production. At that time not many people were interested in this problem, which now has become acute in the State of Texas. The loss of revenue in the State of Texas affects every family—every school child—in fact, every individual. Whether one owns an oil or gas interest or not, it affects us. The loss of State revenue will inevitably mean more taxes from some other source. It will mean less business and fewer jobs. If we are looking for ways and means to bolster the economy gen-
