### Sherry Baker Is Appointed An Invincible

DALLAS Sherry Ann Baker, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Baker, of Ranger, has been appointed an Invincible for the Baptist General Convention of Texas, Andrew Allen, secretary for the convention's Sunday school department, said Thursday.

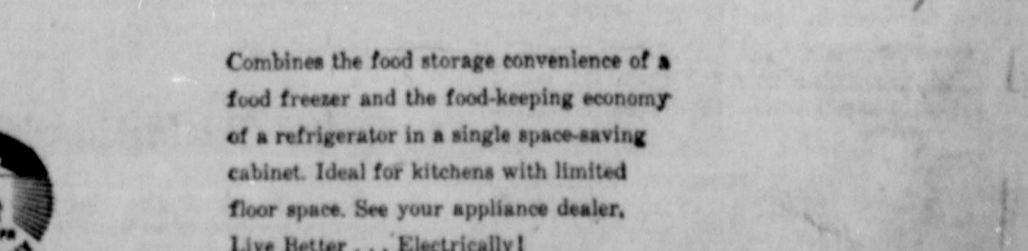

(Continued from Page One) to the capsize... minutes later and began diving for the boy. They were unable to find him, however, Bill Walters Jr. arrived about 30 minutes after the boat overturned. He went into the water in a divers outfit, but he too couldn't locate the body. It was Walters, however, who at 6:40 ended the four hour and 40 minute search for the body. He dove again, without his rig, and brought the boy to surface. The body was pulled into a boat driven by Bill Hoffman and raced to shore. Volunteers worked over his body for some 36 minutes, using artificial respiration and the Volunteer Fire Department resuscitator in their fruitless efforts.

Mrs. Ruth Koonce Elected Member Of Stock Group

Mrs. Ruth Koonce, Route 1, Desdemona, has been elected to membership in the American Shorthorn Breeders' Association, oldest purebred livestock organization in America. Purpose of the group is to collect, verify and preserve pedigrees of Shorthorn and Polled Shorthorn beef cattle and to promote greater use of the breed. Originally known as Durham cattle, the breed took the name Shorthorn from the popular expression after it was found that by cross breeding, the old Western Longhorn cattle grew short horns. The Polled, or naturally hornless, strain was developed after the Civil War. Shorthorns have received international recognition for improvement to today's beef animals.

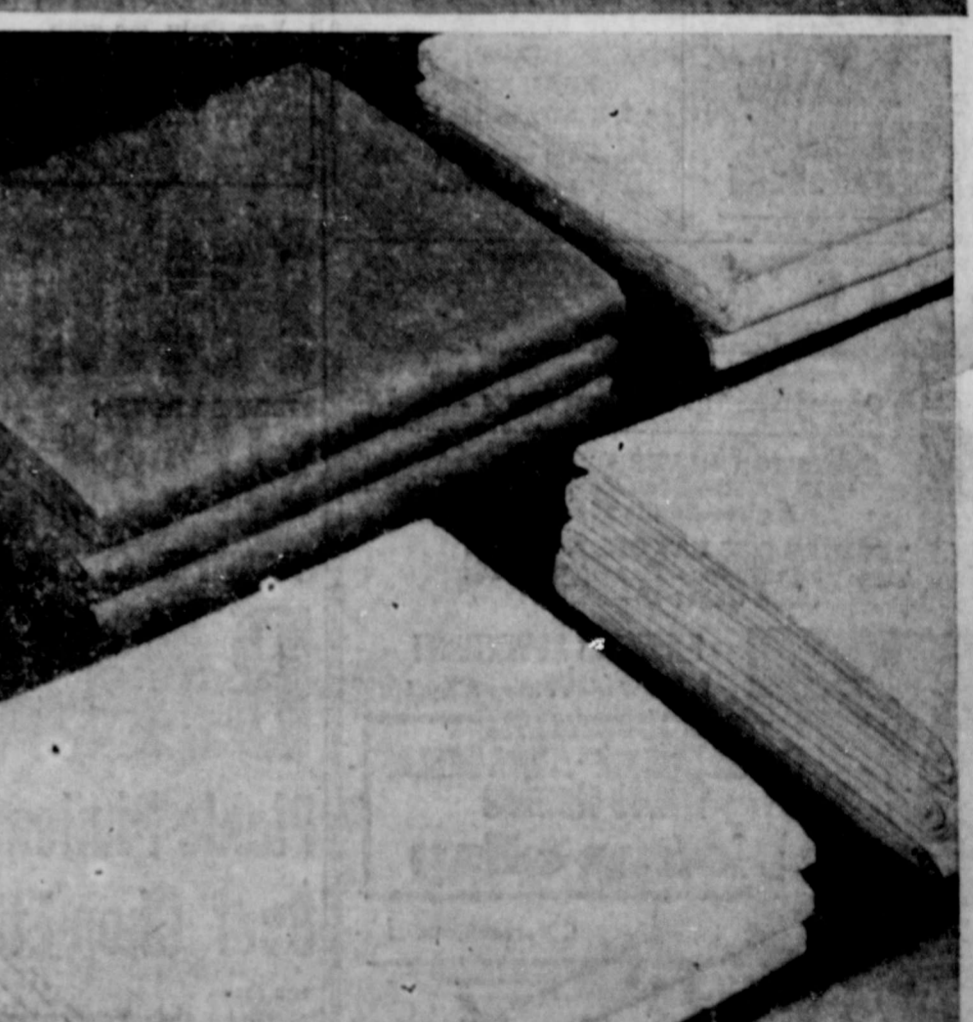
