(Continued from Page One) to the capsized boat minutes later and began diving for the boy. They were unable to find him, how-ever. Bill Walters Jr. arrived about 30 minutes after the boat overturned. He went into the water in a divers outfit, but he too couldn't locate the body. It was Walters, however, who at 6:40 ended the four hour and 40 minute search for the body. He dove again, without his rig, and brought the boy to surface. The body was pulled into a boat driven by Bill Hoffmann and raced to shore. Volunteers worked over his body for some 30 minutes, using artificial respiration and the Volunteer Fire Department resuscitator in their fruitless efforts.

The drowning took place in just eight feet of water. Rescue operations were hampered by moss on the bottom of the lake. Ten boats were used in an effort to hook the body, but the moss made such an operation almost impossible.

Fire Chief Billy Jack Johnson directed rescue operations. Assisting in the rescue were Volunteer Firemen from Cisco, Ranger, Eastland and Breckenridge. National Guardsmen from Ranger and Cis co, Highway Patrolmen from Eastland and Breckenridge, mem bers of the Highway Departmen and City Police also assisted. David was the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. O. Elmore.
