

## **Cattle Judging Benefits From New Techniques**

Techniques are now available for the breeder, the feeder and the meat packer to judge cattle on the hoof. Until recently, the meat and muscle of an animal under the hide could be measured only by slaughtering the animal.

The new techniques are ultrasonics and photogrammetry. They tell exactly how deep the round is, how much of his weight a bull carries in his hindquarters, the size of his ribeye and how much fat covers it-besides a great amount of other important information.

Briefly, ultrasonics means measuring the amount of fat and lean through a cross section of an animal by means of sound waves. This is done with a special device made up of three parts: a transducer; an ultrasonic generator, or pulse echo box; and an oscilloscope. It works on the principle that sound travels at different rates of speed through various substances; specifically, in this instance, that it travels faster throug muscle or lean meat than it does

The second "new eye" the cattleman has acquired is called photogrammetry. This is a means of taking a steroscopic pair of pictures of an animal from which all the important components of the body can be measured with a high degree of accuracy.

There is nothing new about photogrammetry. It is simply a surveying technique and its principles are as old as mathematics. Tri-angulation is the basis of the process. Mrs. Bill Culpepper served the If one dimension is known the other parts of the triangle can be ascertained easily.







If the father is living and has ustody of a minor, he is required to sign the application, otherwise application must be signed by the mother or guardian.

If neither, father is mother or guardian has custody of the minor, then the application must be signed by the employer or judge in the county in which he lives.

"It is unlawful for any person

who has the custody of a minor to permit such minor to operate a motor vehicle without a valid license," Captain Lee said. If a minor is under 16 years

he must meet one of three requirements before being examined for a license.

ONE - he must present a certificate signed by a certified driver education instructor and the school superintendent or principal showing he has successfully passed an approved driver education course in the public school system. TWO - the applicant must present an authorization from the Department of Public Safety showing an emergency necessity for driv-

THREE - the applicant may apoly for a commercial operator's license restricted to motorcycle or motorbike only, not to exceed A person under fourteen years

of age in Texas may not be licensed and must not drive.

If a parent or guardian permits an unlicensedperson to drive, they too can be filed on for permitting an unlicensed minor to drive.


