Gospel of Christ

The Word Of God
 God has always done things through the agency of His word. The worlds were brought into existence through the agency of the word. We find the phrase "And God said" nine different times in the first chapter of Genesis; and always the thing said come to pass. By the power of His word He brought the universe out of chaos. Ps. 33:6-9.

The universe is sustained by the same power. "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto his son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds; who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on High." Heb. 1:1-3.

The word became flesh (John 1:1-14). Christ was the ideal of God; He was the exponent of God's own word. The babe in the manger was God's power clothed in flesh and blood. When Christ returned to the Father, the Spirit brought this power to the apostles, on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:4). Now His power is in the Gospel. According to David, it converts the soul. "The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise, the simple." Ps. 19:7. Paul in Romans 1:16 says the Gospel is not a power, not one of the powers, but THE power of God unto salvation. He further states, "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and

sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." Heb. 4:12.

The word is truth, (John 1:17; 17:17), light (Ps. 119:105), enduring (Ps. 117:2). The word saves the soul. Peter says, "Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently; being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth forever." 1 Pet. 1:22,23. The soul is "brought forth" by the word. "Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his-creatures." James 1:18.

Christians are exhorted to "receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls." Jas. 1:21. To new converts Peter says, "Desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby." 1 Pet. 2:2.

God's word was important in the beginning. Man was directed in the past by it. Blessing here and hereafter depend upon how we receive it. Ye must be begotten by the word, live according to it's precepts, and finally all will be judged by it. "In the day when God shall judge the secrets of men by Jesus Christ according to my Gospel." Rom. 2:16. Why put off obeying it?

TRAGEDY TAKES LIFE OF LITTLE TOM COWAN

Little Tom Cowan, son of Mr. and Mrs. Bart Cowan, was critically burned Thursday afternoon at 5 o'clock when a gasoline barrel at the rear of the Golden Harvest Cafe exploded. Cause of the explosion was not definitely established, but it is believed that the lad either struck the barrel with a hammer causing a spark or struck a match near the barrel. Following the explosion Tom ran into his fathers cafe, his clothing all aflame, where his father in a vain effort to extinguish the flames, was seriously burned about the hands, arms and legs. Two customers in the cafe, Raymond Wilson and Ray Cowser, extinguished the child's flaming clothing by wrapping table cloths and coats around his body, and immediately rushed him to the hospital where he died about 3 hrs. after the explosion.

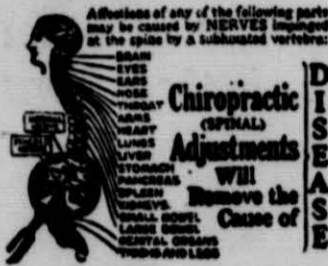
