- The highways of Texas are the property of its citizens. They constitute a system of nearly 200,000 miles of road of which 20,000 miles are desig: nated as State highways and the remainder are county roads. All types of nent" surface.

The total cost of these highways is unknown but it amounts to many hundred million dollars. From 1917 to 1930, inclusive, counties and road districts of the State issued $\$ 243,592,834$ in bonds for the construction and improvement of roads and bridges. In the two-year period ending August 31, 1930, the State Highway Commission expended $\$ 89,032,825$, of which

In view of these tremendous costs the preservation of our highways from ers, viz., the pubsiction is a matter of very vital interest to their the life of the bonds, which run from 20 to 30 years.
The use of the public highways for commercial purposes is not a right but a privilege which may be withheld or granted subject to such restrictions, regulations and charges as the Legislature may see fit to impose. and safeguard the interests of the public.

Texas Railroads, whick. pay the entire cost of construction and maintenance of their own roadbeds and, in addition, make substantial contributions to the cost of Texas highways, are thoroughly regulated with respect to their services, rates, methods and practices. There is no good reason why the public, should not likewise be regulated to such extent as the publie interest requires and pay such charges as wlll represent proper compense tion for the privileges granted them.

- The statutes governing highway tranepprtation as enacted by the Fortysecond Legislature represent the wishes of the citizens of this State and express their desire to give equal righta to all and special privileges to none.
These statutes should be given a fair trial and their value ascertained. Unless this is done, a chaotic condition in transportation as a whole will surely ensue.
