



I believe that a controlled expansion of the currency will be a long step toward recovery, because it brings with it an increase in commodity prices and increased purchasing power. The reflation, or expansion, amendment which has been added to the farm bill contains four major proposals, any or all of which may be used by the President for the purpose of increasing the commodity price level. The first relates to openmarket operations by the Federal Reserve banks; the second provides for the issuance of Treasury notes within certain defined limits; the third relates to the acceptance of silver aggregating two hundred million dollars in payment of debts cyed by foreign governments; and the fourth authorizes a change in the gold content of the dollar or the remonetization of silver. With such a program as this in operation, accomplishing three important steps in the President's program of ultimate national recovery, I have every hope that the farmer will once more assume his proper place in our economic structure, and that America will be well on its way to better times.

I believe that a controlled expansion of the currency will be a long step toward recovery, because it brings with it an increase in commodity prices and increased purchasing power.

The reflation, or expansion, amendment which has been added to the farm bill contains four major proposals, any or all of which may be used by the President for the purpose of increasing the commodity price level. The first relates to openmarket operations by the Federal Reserve banks; the second provides for the issuance of Treasury notes within certain defined limits; the third relates to the acceptance of silver aggregating two hundred million dollars in payment of debts owed by foreign governments; and the fourth authorizes a change in the gold content of the dollar or the remonetization of silver.

With such a program as this in operation, accomplishing three important steps in the President's program of ultimate national recovery, I have every hope that the farmer will once more assume his proper place in our economic structure, and that America will be well on its way to better times.
