## Lions Will Sponsor Football Banquet

Ranger Lions Club will sponsor the annual football banquet for members of the high school and college football teams, again, this year—according to an announcement from Charles Milliken, president.  
 James Townsen will be in charge of the banquet honoring outstanding players this season. A date has not been set for the affair.  
 Directors of the club will meet next Thursday morning at 7 a.m. in King's Cafe.  
 In a recent zone meeting, held in Eastland, Ranger was congratulated upon receiving twice as many new members, in the recent membership drive, as any other Lions Club in the zone.  
 Mrs. Marjorie Theberge, librarian at Ranger College, commented on her experiences, and observations on a European trip which she took in the summer of 1955, on a tour with other librarians, during the Thursday noon meeting of the group.  
 Mrs. Theberge passed through Germany, Switzerland, Belgium, Holland, Great Britain, Paris and Rome on the tour. She also saw the Queen in Edinburg.  
 She said that she did not know if the Europeans resent Americans or not, because clerks are courteous to customers the world over. She does believe that aid to Europe has done a great deal of good, possibly preventing the Communists from farther aggression.  
 "People the world over are very much alike, more alike than they are different," she said. "Man needs religion and a sense of the past," Mrs. Theberge added.  
 She pointed out that the German tendency towards specialization possibly gave rise to Hitler. Later she pointed out some of the problems of foreign aid.  
 In closing, Mrs. Theberge emphasized the need to study foreign languages in order to better communicate with other countries. She said that it was very difficult and complicated for foreigners to enter this country and closed by saying, "Let's get acquainted with our neighbors."



Aberdeen-Angus, one of the biggest cattle classes at the Fort Worth show, will have \$10,000 in prize money allotted for beef breeding classes.

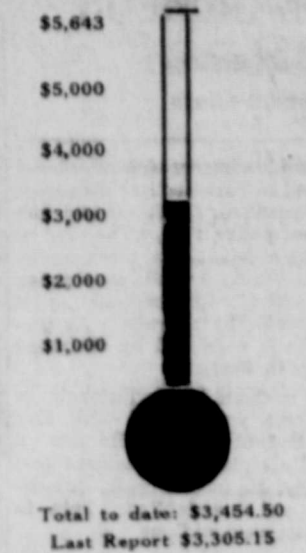

Lots of Quail Are Expected

AUSTIN — Early reports have indicated there'll be a big crop of quail for the opening of the season Dec. 1. Now indications also point to a good crop of quail hunters, according to the assistant director of wildlife restoration of the Game and Fish Commission.

"We've had a lot of good food and cover this year, and a wonderful hatch of birds," he said. "Our men from every part of Texas tell us that conditions are excellent and birds are plentiful."

The quail season begins Dec. 1, and ends Jan. 16. The limit is 12 birds per day, or 36 in possession.

Applications are still coming in for the public hunts to be held on the Gene Howe Wildlife Management area in the Panhandle. These hunts are scheduled for Dec. 6; Dec. 20; Jan. 3, and Jan. 15. All applications must be in the Game Commission office in Austin by 8 a.m. Nov. 14. A drawing then will be held.

The hunters will be paired, with 10 pairs of hunters each day, for a total of 80 hunters. Only persons over 17 will be given permits. The bag limit on this area is 10 birds per person.

Shooters are urged to bring their own dogs. There is a heavy growth of flowering weeds and dogs are needed to prevent loss of birds.
