

TELEPHONE TALK

In answer to demands of citizens and civic organizations in the Tri-City area, a plan has been presented to permit calling between Cisco and Eastland and between Ranger and Eastland without long distance telephone charges. Under this plan which we call Extended Area Service, there will be no change in the long distance charges between Cisco and Ranger.
We feel that the plan we have submitted is the only economical method of providing the service people of this area have requested.
At present, long distance rates between Cisco and Eastland and between Ranger and Eastland are 35c for a three minute person to person call and 15c for a three minute station-to-station call.
The cost of providing Extended Area Service which would eliminate these long distance charges are outlined in the proposed schedule of rates as follows:

These rates are subject to 10% Federal Tax
I personally feel that a telephone arrangement of this nature is good for the Tri-City area. There are many reasons why I feel it is good for the area. Most of the reasons can be summarized in one word—Progress. I have heard, and it appears to be correct that a community, town or area either goes ahead or it backs up. There is no standing still. With the larger towns attracting our young people, this could be a way of getting larger and keeping our young people at home.
Practically everything that is good costs us something. I feel that the increased cost is very reasonable for the good received.
If this Extended Area Service plan is not accepted, the Telephone Company plans to convert Eastland and Ranger to dial operations during the first three months of 1960. If this Extended Area Service plan is accepted by all three towns, it will go into effect at the time of dial conversion.

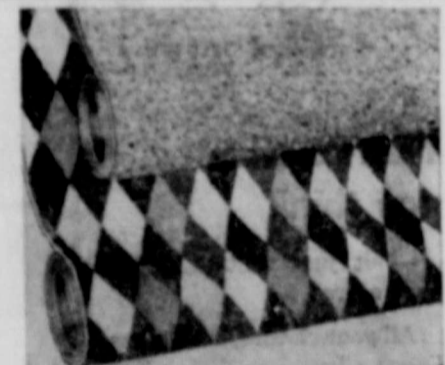

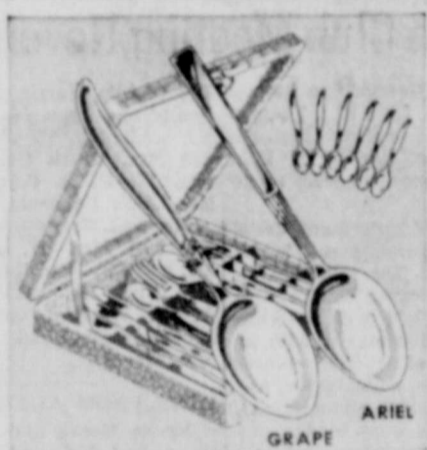
