Calico Stuffed-Idahos



Calico Stuffed Idahos offer an unusual way of serving those wonderful russet-brown Idaho-grown potatoes so plentiful in our markets. Hearty, colorful fare, as sturdy, yet entrancing as the quaint-patterned calico material of yesteryear, these potatoes give nearly as much by way of variety in eye appeal as did those gay little prints. Pictured here is what the well-dressed table will enjoy wearing this season!

Easy-To-Do-Pattern

1. To bake: choose Idaho Russet potatoes of even size. Wash and scrub well. Bake in a 400 degree F. (hot) oven for 1 to 1 1/4 hours or more, depending upon size, baking them until the potato is soft. To test, roll or squeeze in pot holder-protected hands.
2. To stuff: cut large baked Idahos in half or cut tops off smaller potatoes. Scoop out the "middles", leaving enough that the skin will hold up to form a shell. Prepare potato as for Mashed Potato. Fill in desired combination. Heap mixture in potato shells, smoothing surface. Using a fork dipped frequently in cold water, draw it across the filled potato, leaving little ridges.
3. To serve: about 10 to 20 minutes before serving time, depending upon whether or not the stuffed potatoes have been made in the morning and refrigerated, place them in a shallow pan in a 400 degree F. oven and bake until heated through and piping hot.

Combinations to add to the mashed potato:

1. Cheddar cheese finely shredded, shredded carrots slightly cooked in smallest amount of water and drained, snipped parsley, a little chopped Sweet Spanish onion.
2. Pimiento-stuffed olives, sliced, and a spoonful or two of mayonnaise.
3. Ripe olives coarsely-chopped, with bits of cooked ham.
4. Cut chives, bits of cooked chicken. Use dairy-sour cream in place of milk and butter.

Whole Meal Stuffed Idaho: use the whole potato instead of splitting it in half. Fill shell with mashed potato, pushing the potato up around the edges so that a hollow is formed. Fill with any creamed mixture—tuna, chicken, ham, or meat. Sprinkle with grated Parmesan cheese, chopped parsley or chives.

- (3) Okayed the purchase of a pickup truck for Precinct 4 (Cisco) from A & G Motor Co. of Cisco.
- (4) Approved a motion to advertise for bids on a new truck from Precinct 1 (Ranger-Eastland).
- (5) Okayed the re-financing of a \$9000 note by Precinct 4, in order to reduce the interest from six percent to four percent. The road machinery note will be repurchased by the First National Bank of Cisco. Commissioner Carl Lamb said the move would save the county \$128 in interest.
- (6) Authorized County Clerk Johnson Smith to determine if the office of registrar of births and that of justice of the peace could be split.
- (7) Decided to tour the jail to see if repairs requested are needed.

Abilene Reveals Plans To Move 11th District Court of Appeals

Taylor County took another step forward Monday in efforts to move the 11th District Court of Civil Appeals from Eastland to Abilene. Abilene has long had its eye on the juicy court plum, but the Monday effort, announced as a plan to take the court away from Eastland, was the first open shot fired in what promises to be a real battle.

Eastland County citizens were already unhappy with Abilene for their opposition to a plan in the last Legislature which would have strengthened the 91st District Court. Now the Abilene announced goal is to move the 11th Court of Civil Appeals.

Taylor County Commissioners voted Monday to buy six lots on the block east of the courthouse. The Abilene Reporter-News said this would be "... for future expansion purposes and with the possibility in mind that the 11th Court of Civil Appeals at Eastland might eventually come here."

"There has been some work here this year designed to bring about

introduction of a bill in this Legislature to bring about the move," the Reporter-News declared. "Proponents here feel that chances of the move could be enhanced by any action taken by Taylor County to facilitate such a move, such as providing suitable quarters for the court."

The Reporter-News stated that Taylor County Commissioners said it may be at least three years before an actual building program is started. It was emphasized, however, that Abilene would like to get the present Legislature to vote in favor of moving the court.
