A map showing the Texas counties and their open seasons has been prepared by the commission. A study of it will tell you where is legal to hunt in both the North and South zone counties. The season is open Sept. 1 brough Oct. 20 in the North Zone, and Oct. I through Nov. 19 in the South Zone. There is an ex-ception in the Lower Valley counes where mourning doves may be hot at the same time as whitevinged doves. 

SPECIAL NOTE: Unlawful to take white-winged doves or chacheleas South of U.S. Highway 83, formerly State Highway 4, in southern tip of Texas, marked on map as "Game Sanctuary."

SHOTGUNS: Must be plugged permanently to three-shell capacity, may not be larger than 10 gauge. Hunting doves

with rifles prohibited. SHOOTING HOURS: Mourning doves, 12 noon to sunset-except in erees having whitewing season, where the shooting hours will be from 2 p.m. to sunset an September 11, 13, & 15, only. White-winged doves, in season, 2 p.m.
