(Continued from Page One) beauty, all gaiety, all laughter. Let these things be so pure that at any moment you could present them to God. Frankincense is, first of all your worship. And by worship, I do not necessarily mean church attendance as important as that is, I mean the worship of an adoring heart. Unless your daily life is a life of worship, there cannot be much reality in your public worship. Secondly, frankincense stands for all that relates to the spiritual part of you: your ideals, your noblest thoughts, your finest aspirations. Bring these to the King. Myrrh stands for death. Some of us may be called upon to face death for the sake of the Lord's work. But all who have lived unto Him in life can glorify Him in death. This is a gift which brings the giver into the very presence of God. Meanwhile your present offering of myrrh is the death of self—the daily crucifying of the self-life.

Jan. 31—Last day to pay poll taxes.
Feb. 1—Last day for candidates to file to have names placed on primary ballots.
Feb. 4—Last day to pay filing fees for state-wide offices and for justice of court of civil appeals.
Feb. 8—County Executive Committee meets to apportion costs of primary among candidates.
Feb. 13—Last day for candidates to pay assessments.
April 16—Former non-residents or minors who shall have since become eligible to vote must obtain exemption from county tax collector by this date.
April 17 to May 3—Absentee voting for first primary.
May 7—First primary election and precinct conventions.
May 14—County convention.
May 15-31—Absentee voting for second primary.
June 4—Second primary.
June 14—State convention.
July 11—National Democratic Convention.
Oct. 19 to Nov. 4, 1960—Absentee voting for general election.
Nov. 8, 1960—General election.

Paula Angus, Kenneth O. George To Be Married In Near Future

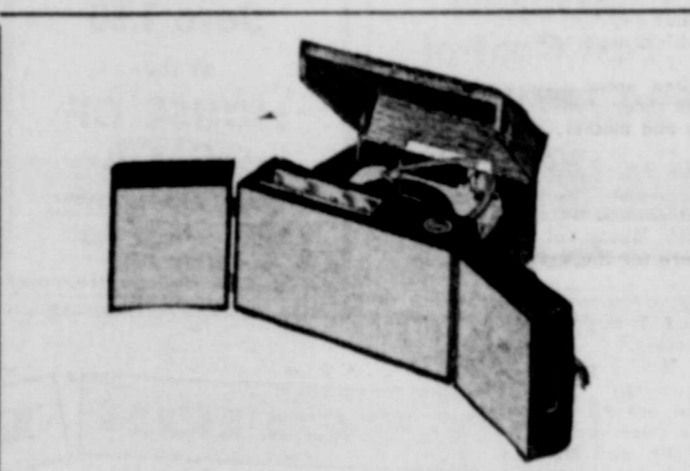
