



# Scald milk. Add sugar, salt and shortening; stir and cool to lukewarm. Measure water into bowl (warm, not hot, water for active dry yeast; lukewarm for compressed). Sprinkle or crumble in yeast; stir until dissolved. Add lukewarm milk mixture. Stir in 2 cups of the flour and beat until smooth; add remaining flour and turn dough out on lightly floured board. Knead until smooth and elastic, about 5 minutes. Place in greased bowl; brush top lightly with melted shortening. Cover and let rise in warm place (85°), free from draft, until doubled in bulk, about 1 hour. Punch dough down and turn out on lightly floured board. Knead the raisins and fruit into the dough. Divide dough into 8 equal pieces; shape into small loaves (elongated rolls). Press into miniature bread pans 4½ x 2½ x 1½ inches. Beat egg yolk and 2 tablespoons cold water together and brush loaves with egg mixture. Cover. Let rise in warm place, free from draft, until doubled in bulk, about 1¼ hours. Cut 3 crosses on top of each loaf with sharp knife. Bake in 375-degree oven 25 to 30 minutes.
