All boats operating in the waters of this state with motors in excess of ten horsepower, regardless of length of the boat, are required to be numbered by the Texas Highway Department before they can legally operate on or after April 1, 1960...

Boats that are propelled by motors of ten horsepower or less are not required to be numbered; but such boats may be, if their owner so desires. However, all boats that are propelled machinery are subject to the provisions of the Act concerning lights, fire extinguishers, and the reporting of boating accidents...
