Veterans New Pension Law Starts July 1

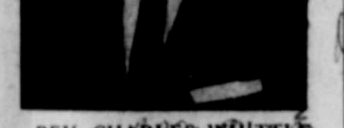

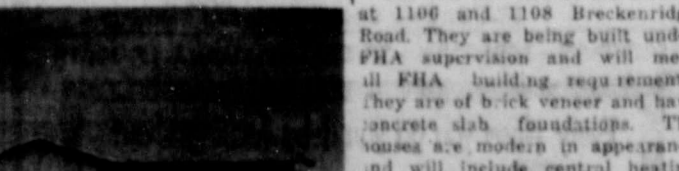
