



"Whosoever goeth onward and abideth not in the teaching of Christ hath not God . . . If any come anto you and bring not this teaching, receive not him into your house, nor give him greeting: For he that gives him greeting partakes in his evil work."—II John: 9-11.

"Behold, a virgin shall conceive and shall bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel, which is interpreted: God with us." Matt. 1:23. "Looking for that blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God, the Lord Jesus Christ." Titus

CONCLUSION: Jesus of Nazereth, the Christ, was diety in fleshly form. The Bible is right.

Witnesses Teach: The primary purpose of Christ was NOT "to ransom and save humankind", *P. 251.

THE BIBLE TEACHES: "Faithful is the saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Jesus came into world to save sinners." I Tim. 1:15.
"And he is the propitiation for our sins: and not for ours only, but for the sins of the whole world.

"God sent his son . . . that the world through him might be saved." John 3:17. CONCLUSION: Jesus and his apostles taught the son came to save humankind and all should accept that truth. The Witnesses say for you not to accept that truth. The Bible is right.

Witnesses Teach: They "are not trying to convert the whole world". +P. 219,

THE BIBLE TEACHES: "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel..." Ma k 16:15. "Go teach all nations..." Matt. 28:19.

... the gospel, which was preached in all creation under heaven ..." Col. 1:23. CONCLUSION: Christ said the gospel was for all, and need be preached throughout the world to all ples: The Witnesses are not trying to do what Christ said. The Bible is right.

Witnesses Teach: "At Revel. 14:1-3, the Bible is conclusive in predicting that the final number of heavenly church will be 144,000." +P. 113.

THE BIBLE TEACHES: At Revel, 14:4 that these mentioned 144,000 are also virgin men. "These afthey which are not defiled with women, for they are virgins." And Rev. 7:4-8 further signifies these 144,000 are of Israel, Jews.

CONCLUSION: Honest Bible interpretation demands if one part of a context must be taken as literal, then all must: therefore the Witnesses exclude from heaven all women, all girls, all husbands, all fathers: In other words if you were not a Jewish male virgin on earth, there is not heavenly hope. That which proves too much proves nothing.

THE BIBLE TEACHES: "And they were terrified and affrighted, and supposed they beheld a spirit. And he said, why are ye troubled and wherefore do questionings arise in your heart? 




