### Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER FOUR ON THE BALLOT

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 1960.

**HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 4** proposing an Amendment to Section 13, Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas, so as to give the Legislature authority to classify loans and lenders, license and regulate lenders, define interest, fix maximum rate of interest, and provide for a maximum rate of interest of ten per centum (10%) per annum in the absence of legislation setting maximum rate of interest; providing that the rate of interest shall not exceed six per cent (6%) per annum in contracts where no interest rate is agreed upon; providing for the right of appeal and trial de novo in the event any regulatory agency cancels or refuses to grant any permit; providing for the necessary actions and the form of the ballot; and providing for the necessary proclamation and publication.

**SECTION 13. That Section 13, Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended so as to hereinafter read as follows:**  
**Section 13.** The Legislature shall have authority to classify loans and lenders, license and regulate lenders, define interest, fix maximum rate of interest, and provide for a maximum rate of interest of ten per centum (10%) per annum in the absence of legislation setting maximum rate of interest; providing, however, in the absence of legislation fixing maximum rate of interest that the rate of interest shall not exceed six per cent (6%) per annum in contracts where no interest rate is agreed upon; providing for the right of appeal and trial de novo in the event any regulatory agency cancels or refuses to grant any permit; providing for the necessary actions and the form of the ballot; and providing for the necessary proclamation and publication.
