AUSTIN REPORT

By SCOTT BAILEY REP. OF 76th DISTRICT

At this writing the regular session of the 57th Legislature is half way over. The first 60 days is devoted to the introduction of bills and resolutions. The second 60 day period is devoted to hearings and floor action. It now takes a four-fifths majority vote to even introduce a bill. This should begin the real serious consideration of controversial key issues.

Hudson, to allow the permanent school fund to be invested partly in corporation securities; Senate Bill 24 and 32 by Senator Willis of Tarrant County, two of the Women's Equal Rights Bills; the House State Affairs Committee reported House Bill 61 by Burgess, the Milk Sanitation Bill; the Labor Committee sent House Bill 26 by Hughes, the Industrial Safety Bill, on to the House floor. Two tax bills have passed the House—Senate Bill 39 by Crump requires a written declaration instead of a notarization on tax returns. (This was very much needed by small business men because the notary very often was higher than the tax fee paid in.) House Bill 46 by Adams of Lubbock which revised the present Inheritance Tax Law and is designed to increase collections. Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 27 by Gonzalez is now pending. This resolution would order the Board of insurance to abandon the safe driving—insurance plan. The five so-called Loan Shark Revision Bills, House Bills 7, 40, 508, 631 and 672 went to the Banks and Banking Committee and are now pending in a subcommittee. Many interested citizens have contacted me in regard to House Bill 680 by Representative Roberts of Seminole. This bill, if enacted into law, would move the 11th Court of Civil Appeals from Eastland to Abilene. After much inquiry, I have found very little
