

And can you imagine God calling men to preach another gospel, as many declare to be so, that they would be accursed for? The gospel was preached and wrote in the New Testament by the Apostles and Prophets (Eph. 1:1-5). Now would this gospel have saved Mr. Wesley? It would have. So why the need of another? Will Christ's gospel save today? It will. Is it the ame today as in the days of the apostles? It is, and it will never change (1 Pe. 1:25). 


