Needed In Farm Pond Building

Thinking about building a farm pond? If you are, some careful planning is in order, says W. L. Ulich, extension agricultural engi-

Ulich says the first step is to decide what the pond is going to be used for-irrigation, livestock water, fishing, recreation, etc. If it is to be used for irrigation, and you have a choice of site to Botanical Gardens and Tex-Headquarters Building in Fort to the fields to be irrigated. If

> the pond during dry periods, but not so large that it will create flood dazards during heavy rains. Watersheds may vary from 10 to 100 or more acres, depending of the rainfall and how much water you want to store. If possible, select a watershed covered with grass or woodland. If you culti vate part of the watershed, however, be sure to use erosion con

Ulich continues, After you have selected a tentative site, test the soil to make sure it will hold water. The best oil is deep to bedrock, and is heavy, with a lot of clay. Try to woid sites with rock outcropping along the bank, or with rock or shale ledges near the surface. Also stay away from sites having sand, gravel, peat or mari through which the water might seep. If you build the pond on a shallow soil, don't orrow the dirt for the fill from he pond area itself, but get it from me other area.

Corroded, frayed or partially broken battery, starter and gen-erator cables frequently are an indication that the interior meta strands have become brittle, and that the entire cable is apt to Cables in this condition should be replaced to eliminate high resistance in the various circuits which may result in eventual Pointing to the fact that many starting failure if not corrected.
