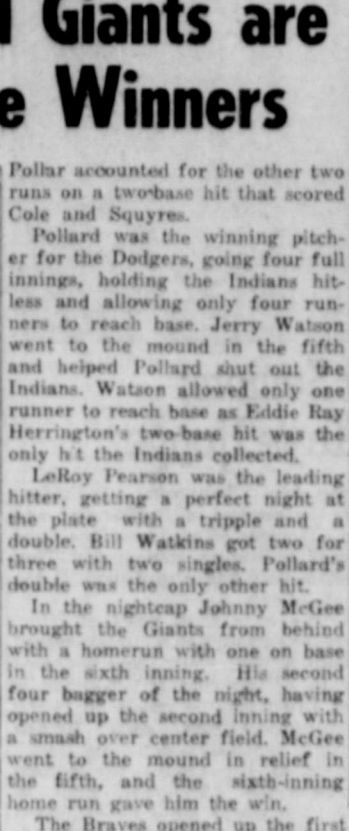

## TELEPHONE TALK

#### TELEPHONES OF THE FUTURE

The other day I was having lunch with some friends and we got to talking about how much the telephone has changed in the last few years. We talked about the development of color phones, wall phones and the latest one — the Princess, the first compact phone.

This conversation reminded me of some of the ideas for new kinds of telephones and communications services we're working on now. Some of these ideas will never leave the drawing board. Others will fall by the wayside during the test stage. And some, of course, will be successful — and will eventually be available for your use.

For instance, there's the "dia-in-hand" phone. It has the dial in the receiver. You lift the receiver, hold it in your hand, and dial. The dial lights up when you lift the receiver, too.

Or, how about a picturephone? This telephone of the future will transmit pictures as well as sound, so people will be able to see each other as they talk on the phone. The picturephone has been successfully tested, but it will be quite a while before it is available for widespread public use.

But here's a new phone you may have in the not-too-distant future. It's a small new wall phone called the Slimphone. The Slimphone is trim, not much wider than a Princess phone. It should come in handy for the kitchen and other rooms because it doesn't take up much space.

These are just a few — a sampling — of new kinds of telephones and telephone services we're working on for the future. But even today we enjoy telephone services most of us never dreamed possible just 10 years ago.

#### CAN YOU GUESS WHAT IT IS?

Like to work riddles? Here's one that ought to be easy.

What is it that's found in almost every home, store, business office, church, school and public building? It helps you find things, people and services. It's ready to help you any time—night or day—every day of the week.

I'd be mighty surprised if you didn't know it was the Yellow Pages of your telephone directory. Studies show that nine out of ten people reach for the Yellow Page directory when they're ready to buy. How about you??

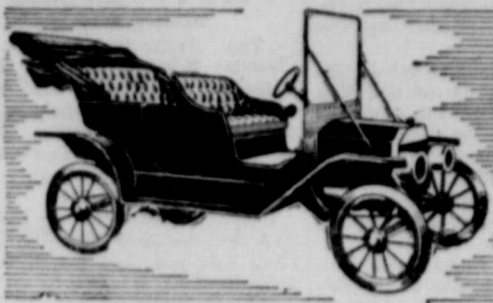
