which will include Eastland County. The district will be numbered 63 and will include Eastland, Callahan and Shackelford counties from the old 76th District, plus Palo Pinto and Stephens counties. Eastland County has always nominated the old 76th District, having had more than a majority of the voters. That may not be true in the future. Eastland and Palo Pinto counties are about the same size in population. Palo Pinto has the edge by 990.

The population breakdown in the new district will look like this:

Palo Pinto	20,516
Eastland	19,526
Stephens	8,885
Callahan	7,929
Shackelford	3,990

This should tend to show that the Eastland County vote will still play an important part in selecting the district's representative. It will not be so important as in the past, however.

## Lone Star Gas Employees Get Company Awards

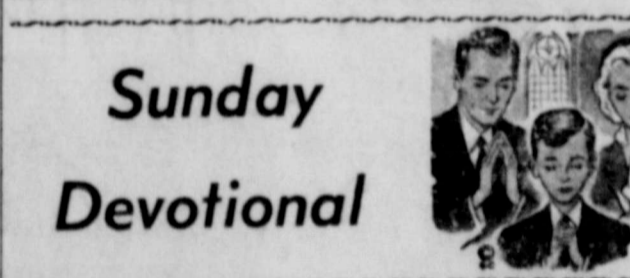

## Text of New Incentive School Bill Published

(Editor's Note: Signing into law the new incentive payment school consolidation bill has created much interest in Eastland County. So that citizens may better understand the new law, Senate Bill 80 is being published in full text.)

### Begins

AN ACT authorizing incentive aid payments to certain independent school districts; specifying the conditions for such incentive payments, and making other provisions relating thereto; containing a severability clause; and declaring an emergency.  
Section 1. From the effective date of this Act independent school districts hereafter created through consolidation may qualify for Incentive Aid Payments by the State of Texas; provided, however, no school district may receive such payments for a period of more than ten (10) years. Such Incentive Aid Payments shall be made only upon application to the Texas Education Agency and in compliance with the terms and conditions contained in this Act.

## RJC Summer Registration Begins Monday

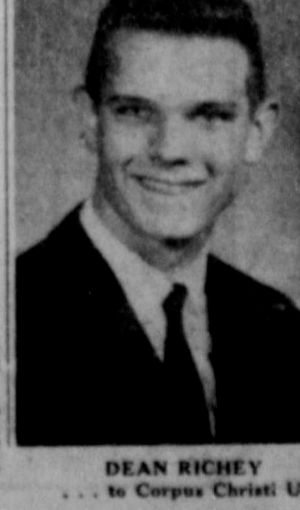

herby expressly repealed to the extent of such conflict only, but this Act shall be cumulative of all other laws or parts of laws not directly in conflict herewith.

Sec. 4. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provision of this Act are declared severable.

Sec. 5. The fact that strong local school districts with adequate fiscal capacities are essential to high quality programs of public education equally available to all youth of this State; the fact that this State's School Foundation program now penalizes constructive school district reorganization by reducing state assistance to reorganized districts; and the fact that there is a critical need to provide incentives for local initiative to improve educational opportunities, create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the Constitutional Rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each House be suspended; and said Rule is hereby suspended, and this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after September 1, 1961, and it is so enacted.

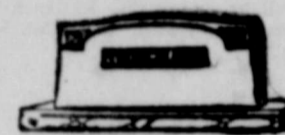
