D. C. Cox, chairman of the Callahan County Great Plains Conservation Program committee, reports that the committee has received 29 applications consisting of 27,407 acres from Callahan county farmers and ranchers requesting assistance



Pictured above is the result of brush control on the Randall C. and Rupert L. Jackson Ranch five miles southwest of Baird. Oak Brush was controlled on 177 acres in the spring of 1961 with heavy rolled chopper and seeded with native grasses. This operation was followed by deferment to allow grasses to become established and resprouts were controlled by use of goats in fall and early spring. In the above picture, D. C. Cox of Baird, soil conservationist examines some of the grasses which are growing abundantly on the Jackson Ranch.

from the program. Cox stated that 19 of these applicants on 21,544 acres have already worked out conservation plans on their farms and ranches with assistance from the Soil Conservation Service, and they are now obtaining cost sharing assistance in carrying out their plans. In addition to these 19, two more applicants on 1382 acres are scheduled to complete their plans during September.

Farmers and ranchers in the program have already earned cost sharing assistance in seeding 292 acres of old cropland fields to permanent grass, controlled brush on 3351 acres of rangeland and seeded 1507 acres of this land to native grasses, constructed 10 farm ponds, and installed 23,758 feet of permanent cross fences.

These practices are a part of a complete scheduled soil and water conservation plan that these farmers and ranchers have worked out on their operating units.

Cox said that to complete their plans, they would get additional help in controlling 7,341 acres of brush, reseed 1647 acres native rangeland, install 17,270 feet of fences, convert 585 acres cropland to grassland, construct 3351 feet of Diversion terraces, install 3 livestock water wells, install 2 permanent water storage facilities, construct 2 grassed waterways, construct 13 farm ponds, and construct 34,320 feet of terraces.

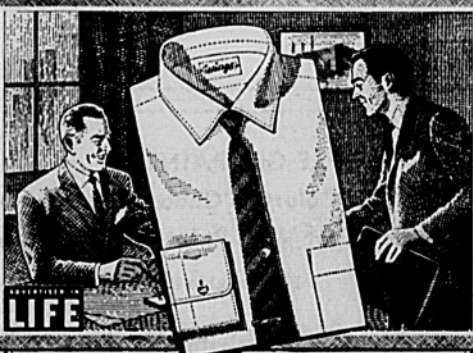

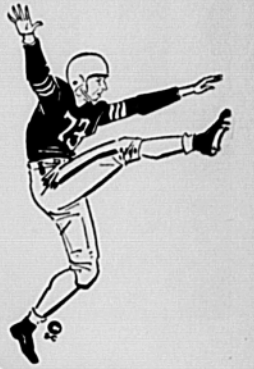

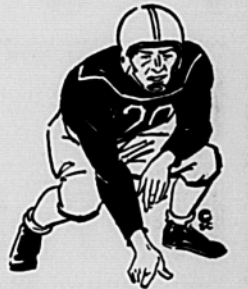
