Edward Heary Harriman degan his caroer as clerk in a broker otfice on
Wall street. He showed no unusual Wall street. He showed no unusual
abillty and for many years gave no ablity and for many years gave no
promise of his latter brillant development. Soolally he was well liked and those who knew him at that time deseribed him as a soclable young man,
always full of fun. He was noted, howalways full of fun. He was noted, how-
ever, for a mind of his own. What he wanted he generally obtained, but his desires and ambitions were at that time at least netther very sweeplig nor parIeularly important.
How he obtained his start and the
funds which enabled him to buy seat on the New York Stock Exchange, has never been clearly explatined. The most widely accepted explanation,
however, was to the effeet that during however, was to the effect that during
the famous "gold corner'" engineered the tamous "gold corner" englineered
by Gould, Flsk, Nimber and others, Edward H. Harriman plunged with all his own money and some borrowtd trom his brother Orlando and cleared enough to buy for himself in August,
1870 a seat on the New York Stock 1870 a seat
Exchange.
Young Harriman married In early Ife and married very well. His wife Was Miss Mary Averell of Rochester, N. Y., whose tather was a capitalist
and a successful ralliond man.

was said to have made a large amount of money in the Rome, Watertown \& Ogdensberg Rallroad. This marriage considerably strengthened the hands of young Harriman for the battle of life. It was in every wey
and happy alliance.
For a number of years the broker firm of E. H. Harriman \& Co. did a chriving business on Wall street, spec-
ulating with its own funds and exe cutting - commissions for the Vander-
bilts and other wealthy clients. It not until 1883 that E. H. Harriman came actively into the railroad field.
At that time he had become known as a capitalist, one of the few who had gathered together a great fortune in
ten troubled years between 1870 and ten troubled years between 1870 and
1880 . He was credited whua naving in
his strong box a fair list of stocks he had plcked up at extremely low prices

ever subscribed by the syndicate for the creation of the great Harriman system. The members of the syndicate recelvtd back every oent they hal tavested withtn three years and all the
subsequent purchases of raltroeds were subsequent purchases of raltrogas were
made on the credit of the Union Pacficie ond the few other ines inder its control.
Harriman soon became the controll-
ing spirit of the Unan ing spirit of the Union Paciffic and by
