### AMUSEMENTS

Tim Murphy, the tall comedian, will present his latest success, "Cupid and the Dollar," at the Wichita Theatre, Saturday, Oct. 2nd.

Like John T. Raymond, Joseph Jefferson and Sol Russell, whose art his own resembles, Tim Murphy is essentially quaint and gentle, sentimental as well as funny, and like those predecessors in the royal line of comedy his humor is always American. Asked the other day where he got his types and where he studied them, Murphy replied: "My studio is wherever I am." Joel Chandler Harris never had a fixed writing room. He sat down at the first table he came to when the inspiration for one of those delightful Uncle Remus stories came to him. When Tim Murphy was told this of his old friend, he continued: "I can understand that perfectly. It is a curious mental machine which will not work except when seated in some particular environment. For my part, I find that my characters develop best unconsciously. They grow out of the suggestion of the striking phases of human nature which I find in my travels—in a railway car, at my own dining table, at church, in the theatre, on the street, every where human nature is expressing itself for the artist with an eye which does not merely look, but sees as well."

He went on to tell that it was on this principle that he developed the amusing characteristics of his new role in "Cupid and the Dollar." This is an original American three-act comedy by Charles Jeffrey, a new dramatist discovered by Mr. Murphy, but firmly established by his first success. 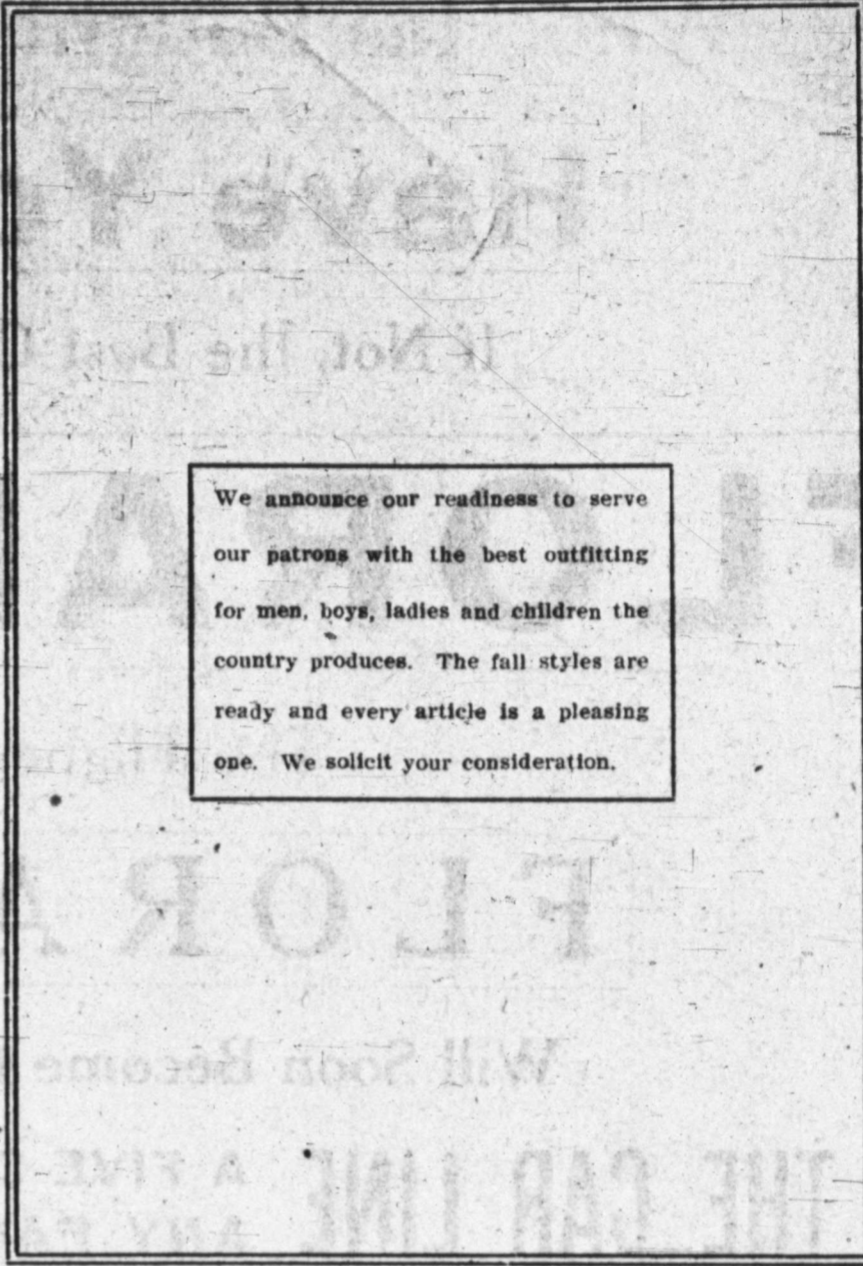
