make prompt report of the appearance make prompt report of the appearance
of all contaglous diseases, espectally small pox and diptheria, to the county health officer and that they mainalan
proper quarantine and fsolation and make use of proper disinfectants.
The formality The formality of placing the yellow
nag, of placards, on the front gate or nag. of placards, on the front gate or
other conspltctous place, must not be neglected, and the parents or responsible members of the family, should be
acquainted with the Instructions of the accuainted with the

as shail immediately report in writing or by an acknowledged telephone communtcation, to the health officer in
