### COMPLETE **POSSESSION OF REBELS**

FOLLOW UP ADVANTAGE GAINED YESTERDAY AND AFTER DESPERATE FIGHTING SILENCE FEDERAL FIRE—DRIVE OUT DEFENDERS

### MANY OF THE FEDERALS FLEE SOUTHWARD

One Detachment Took Refuge in The Barracks Where They Hold Out Until The Cannon Balls Tear Building To Pieces-Navarro Reported Captured

Associated Press. El Paso, May 10.—Juarez is in possession of the insurrectos this aft rnoon. Most of the federals are retreating but General Navvarro is reported parricaded with a few faithful followers in the barracks and de-

clares he will hold out there for a week.

It was the strategy of General Blenco and three hundred rebel reinforcements which last night got in behind the Juarez jail which gave the rebels the upper hand today.

It is said Navarro's troops ran short of ammunition Victors found between thirty and forty dead federals in the streets around the church and the jail and the authorities at the federal hospital admitted treating over a hundred wounded federals, also that Col. Tamberal, who taunted the rebels was wounded. Col. Pueblito, commanding thefederal cavalry was wounded. It is known that four Americans with

the insurrectos were killed.

LATER—The rebel artillery tore four big holes in the barracks and it was surrounded at 12:45. The rebel victory then being complete and the only firing was away in the foothills to the South

As soon as the rebels captured the down town buildings this forenoon they began destroying the intoxicants. The insurrectos got one cannon in position to fire on the barracks at noon. Defenders were shooting only occasionally. The first cannon shot tore a great hole in the structure and others quickly made it untenable. Estimates of the number of dead and injured are growing rapidly. ### **EXTEND NORTHWESTERN** TO THE CANADIAN RIVER

ALL ARRANGEMENTS FOR BUILDING LINE BEYOND HAMMON, OKLA., HAVE BEEN COMPLETED AND WORK WILL START AT ONCE

#### THE LINE MAY BE BUILT TO WOODWARD

It is Also Expected That a Contract Will be Closed With The Graham People For Extension of

Southern to That Place

Work is to be started at once on an extension of the Wichita Falls & Northwestern from Hammon, Okla., north to the Canadian River and from there it is believed the extension will be continued to Wood-

All arrangements for this extension have been completed and work is expected to start within the next thirty days.

J. A. Kemp returned today from a business trip to the east, wher he had gone on matters connected with their railroad interests, with special reference to the extension of the system in this state and in Oklahoma, and in conversation with a Times reporter this afternoon he gave assurance of early activities along this line.

In discussing the matter Mr. Kemp stated that they expected to be gin work at once on the extension of the Wichita Falls & Northwestern from Hammon north to the Candian river and from there the road would be extended on to Woodward, Okla., as heretofore contemplated. The details of the proposed extension have practically been worked out and surveying has already been in progress on the route, including the survey of the Canadian river at the prospective crossing. While Mr. Kemp did not go into further details, regarding their plans but stated that the extension as outlined above had been devided upon.

Asked regarding the extension of the Wichita Falls & Southern from Newcastle to Graham, Mr. Kemp said: "There is under consideration a proposition to extend the Southern from Newcastle to Graham, in fact, a proposition has been submitted to us by the Graham people, which if accepted will mean that the road will be built at an early date. However, the contract for the extension has not been closed as yet." 

### **GREAT SALT LAKE**

Puzzling Aspects of Utah's Wonderful Saline Sea.

ONE OF NATURE'S MYSTERIES

Science Unable to Solve the Problem of Its Escaping Waters and Diminishing Area-The Maelstrom Near Antelope Island.

The Great Salt lake of Utah conthues to be one of the greatest mysteries of nature. For sixty years its rise and fall have been studied by scientists in an effort to account for the changes, but as yet they have reached no satisfactory solution of the problem as to what is the principal cause of the decrease in its depth.

Those familiar with its depth and the shrinking in its size each year assert that at the end of twenty yearsor so the bed of the lake will be nearly all exposed, with the possible exception of a few shallow pools of water. Then perhaps the mystery connected with it will be solved.

In its dimensions the lake is really sea, it being above seventy-five miles in length and fifty miles across at its greatest vidth, containing, therefore, over 2,600 square miles of surface Near the thores the water is so shall low\_that there are places where one may woode out from the beach for a distance of a mile, yet will not be immersed up to his shoulders.

The bnovancy of the water is such that it is almost impossible for one to remain on his feet at a greater depth, his body being lifted up as a strip of wood thrown into the water in a vertical or oblique direction like a dart is returned to the surface in a

horizonfal position Indeed, It is believed the Great Salt lake will support more weight to a given volume of water than even the Dead sea, to which in many respects it bears a striking similarity.

The large quantity of salt in solu tion is the principal reason for the buoyaney. As the lake recedes its bottom is shown to be composed of a heavy crust of salt, which is almost pure, lying upon a stratum that consists chiefly of sand. In this respect the bed of the take is similar to some of the deserts in the southwest which once contained bodies of water equal in size to that in Ctah or even larger.

It is known that the threat Salt lake loses a large quantity of water yearly by evaporation, but estimates of this quantity indicate that it is far less than that annually poured into the lake from the rivers and creeks enter

So far as is known no natural outle exists, but the lake supplies an irrigatng system in the country adjacent that requires a quantity of water yearly equal to a depth of four inches of the present area. This is a very small proportion of the volume of water that nters it through its feeders, so the cientists know-the-water escapes in some other manner than by the irrigation canal or by evaporation.

This is proved by the fact that the increase in the quantity that enters the lake at a ramy season at times does not increase its depth, and the records show that actually it has fallen immediately after the Jordan and other streams have contributed a larger volume than-usual.

Near what is called Antelope island is an indication that a subterraneau opening exists. Frequently the waters near the island are so violently disturbed that people in the vicinity call this place the "maelstrom" and carefully avoid it when on the lake in

A number of years ago, it is said, a ailing vessel loaded with sheep hanced to approach too near the "maeistrom," and despite the strong breeze that was blowing the force of the water was greater than the power of the sails, the vessel being drawn into the middle of the disturbance and capsized. Although sheep are natural ly strong swimmers and land was but a few hundred feet away, not one of the animals escaped and most of the rarcasses went under never to appear

again. While the buoyancy of the water is so great that it will support a person without aid, the boats designed for use upon the lake must be constructed especially to counteract this feature. The erdinary wooden vessel when empty is actually too light to be navigated with safety upon it, since such a small portion of it would be immersed. Care must therefore be taken, especially in the building of sailbonts, lest they be top heavy. For this reason navigation is dangerous on the lake even when there is only a moderate wind, unless the sailing vessel is loaded beavily so that it sits deep enough in the water to counteract the buoyant tendency.-New York Press.

OLD CRIMINAL LAW.

When Prisoner's Counsel Was Not Al lowed to Address the Jury. It seems hardly credible that less than a century ago counsel were not sllowed to address a jurg in defense of a prisoner. Sydney Smith first

preached against this cruel law. He pointed out that, while in any court where property was concerned counsel was heard on both sides, in a court where human life was trembling in the balance only the prosecution counsel was heard, and it was unfair to match a prisoner, unaccustomed to marshal facts and unable to speak against skilled counsel, whose sole purpose for its own reputation was to win a case. Sydney Smith's eloquent words led to the passing of the prisoner's defense act, 1820, which alter

ed the practice. Another unjust practice which was peculiar to the Old Bailey was that when an accused person was acquitted he was obliged to pay the fees of Newgate or go back for want of money. So many unfortunate prisoners died in Newgate through this that Alderman Brown, lord mayor in 1733. caused an order of the court to be made that when any accused persons were acquitted by their country they should instantly be discharged in court without paying any fees whatserit, an order which has been strict ty adhered to ever since.
