Mrs. Nancy Morckel Speaks To Homemakers On Home Freezing

Mrs. Nancy Morckel, Home Economist, Lighthouse Electric Cooperative, Inc., Floydada spoke to Young Homemakers at a meeting Thursday, July 15.
She gave a short history of man's

efforts to preserve foods and a demonstration of modern methods of "home freezing."

Mrs. Morckel stressed time saving simple directions for most popular foods in the freezing department. She emphasized the types of foods to have in deep freezer in case of company or for busy days. Mrs. Morckel stressed the importance of preparing foods properly for best results.

The speaker said, "You get out of a freezer what you put in it." According to Mrs. Morckel, freezing food is the modern way to better eating. Having a well stocked food freezer means new convenience in greater variety in the family's meals and a better year-round balanced diet.

The speaker commented, "Foods, when properly packaged, frozen and stored, will be as delicious and attractive when served after a few months' storage as they would have

been had they been served fresh." "Be sure when freezing foods to package correctly; so they will not dry out, lose color and flavor and become unpalatable.

Mrs. Morckel recommended the following steps for preparing vegetables.

1. Gather vegetables in the cool of the morning, gather only choice vegetables and only quantities that can be handled.
2. Wash and sort vegetables carefully.
3. Scald or steam according to the directions for each kind of vegetable.
4. Cool and drain quickly.
5. Pack in AIRTIGHT containers.
6. Start freezing at once.

Mrs. Morckel points out "in freezing vegetables, steaming, scalding or blanching is a MUST, never to be omitted. It retards enzymatic action thus stopping deterioration. It saves vitamins, and improves the color."

She continued, "Scald or blanch approximately one pound of any vegetable at a time. Steam will penetrate evenly through this amount while through larger amounts it may not, thus making an inferior product."

Highway Patrol Investigates Rural Accidents

The Highway Patrol investigated three rural traffic accidents in Castro County during the month of June, according to Sergeant W. E. Wells, Patrol Supervisor of this area. These wrecks accounted for five injuries and an estimated property damage of \$1,778.00.

The rural traffic accident summary in Castro County for the first six months of 1965 shows a total of 41 crashes resulting in one persons killed, 36 persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$23,760.00.

"As of the first of this month, there had been a total of 1,040 fatal crashes in Texas taking lives of 1,261 persons," the Sergeant stated. This is approximately two percent less than for the same period of 1964; we will in all probability exceed the all time record high of 3,006 persons killed in traffic crashes experienced

in Texas last year. Texas was fortunate over the 4th of July weekend in that the predicted number of persons were not killed, but we cannot brag, as 25 persons were killed over the holiday while in the rest of the nation we experienced a great increase over last year, and set a new all time record for deaths over the 4th of July holiday just as we did during the previous Memorial Day holiday. The veteran Patrol Supervisor concluded that with the vacation season well underway more vehicles will be traveling streets and highways,
