### DEATH REVEALS HE IS HEIR TO BIG FORTUNE

#### Had Been Living in Ranger Under Assumed Name Ten Years.

Bill Davis, 49, negro trash wagon driver of Ranger, who died Saturday night, was identified early today as Buck Carter, heir to an estate in the Carter oil pool in Oklahoma, which is valued at more than a million dollars. A reward of \$10,000 has been standing for some time for information as to Davis' whereabouts and his identity was not known until he died. He had lived in Ranger for about 10 years.

### MAYOR THURMAN IN FAVOR OF PASSAGE OF NEW GAS RATE

#### Other Cities Are Passing Similar Measures Designed to Reduce Rates Paid for Gas; Commission is Unanimous in Vote for Ordinance.

At the regular weekly meeting of the Ranger city commission held Tuesday night a motion by L. R. Pearson and seconded by Dr. Harry A. Logsdon, the commission voted unanimously to draw up an ordinance lowering the gas rates in the city of Ranger. No figure was set for the new rate, but it was suggested that a careful study of the situation be made and a rate be established that would be fair to both the gas company and to the people of Ranger.

### The Mayor Said:

"No relief from this situation will be forthcoming unless we take some action first. Now is the time to fight and I am in favor of starting that fight right now. The longer we wait the longer the people of Ranger will have to pay high gas rates. Other cities are going to take similar action and we can gain more right now than we could by waiting until winter sets in and the people are using more gas than the minimum and paying exorbitant rates. Let's start a fight and stay in there until we win. It may cost us a little money, but it will be worth it in the saving to the people of Ranger."
