#### ALL OVER THE WORLD.

King George has given his assent to the Statute of Westminster which creates a status of equality between between Great Britain and her colonies, giving the colonies full power to enact legislation independent of the government of London. Great Britain, speaking through its parliament, has burned its free trade bridges and now the dominions will supply the wheat markets or the wheat demands of the British Isles and the American wheat grower will find himself shut out. Winston Churchill, who is in this country gathering in American dollars as a lecturer, predicts that the protective policy has come to stay and that the coalition government will not be disturbed for five years to come.

It appears that the tariff is a two-edged sword. Uncle Sam is going to feel the edge of the European sword. Spain is a republic. The first act of its government was to an-nounce a reduction of 50 per cent on the tariff on automobile products entering that country but in doing so has ruled that vehicles manufactured in the United States should not share in the decrease. Now President Hoover has been asked to invoke against Spain the penalty clause of the tariff Act of 1830. 




