Fresh Forty-Four Years

ENGLAND is beginning to take an interest in canning. An illustrated supplement of the London Times featuring the British Canning Industry recently stated with true British conservatism: "It is something of a reproach to our economic discernment that, owing to the national habit of being too easily contented with things as they are, the bulk of our native manufacturers should have been generations behind their oversea competitors (that's us—the U. S.) in adopting the use of hermetically sealed metal containers as a safe and simple means of providing the public, in season and out of season, with never-failing supplies of such perishable foods as fruits, vegetables, fish and meat."

In substantiation of this statement as to saateness the supplement says elsewhere: "An interesting sidelight on the duration of canned foods was supplied some years ago when Captain Ross, of H. M. S. Investigator, discovered in Regent's Inlet the stores of the crew H. M. S. Fury. The Fury had been wrecked there in 1824. The stores, which had been recovered eight years after the wreck, were brought home and taken to Liverpool. At a lecture arranged by the Royal Society of Arts in 1868, one of the tins of meat was opened and its contents were found to be in a state of perfect preservation." "This might not seem a modern instance to an American editor, but, in England, anything that happened as late as 1868 is news!"

A \$2 Dinner for 6



HERE is an unusual—and an unusually good—menu with an intriguing Spanish dash to it, and the additional advantage of costing only two dollars.

- Baked Stuffed Spanish Mackerel 83¢
- Potato Puffs on Grain 20¢
- Spanish Lima Beans 24¢
- Bread and Butter 11¢
- Tomato and Cucumber Salad 22¢
- Orange Marshmallow Jelly with Whipped Cream 25¢
- Coffee with Cream 15¢

Baked Stuffed Spanish Mackerel: Select two-pound Spanish mackerel, have head and tail removed and fish split down middle. Salt and pepper inside. Sauté one small chopped onion in one-fourth cup butter, add one-half cup crumbs, three-fourths teaspoon salt, pepper to taste and one teaspoon capers; then hot water to thoroughly moisten. Stuff fish with this, and tie securely. Lay in baking dish and pour round it one 6-ounce can evaporated milk and two-thirds cup water. Bake half an hour in moderate oven. 37½¢. Remove fish to hot platter.

Thicken liquid in pan with one tablespoon butter rubbed in one tablespoon flour, adding more liquid if necessary. Season to taste, strain and pour round fish. Serves six.

Spanish Lima Beans: Dice two long slices bacon, and fry them with one small chopped onion. Add one can diced lima beans, drained. Season to taste with salt and pepper, and pour into buttered baking dish. Add enough bean liquid to moisten, about one-half cup; place in hot oven till brown on top.*

Potato Jackets Filled with Creamed Codfish: Melt one and one-half teaspoons butter, add one and one-half teaspoons flour, and stir smooth. Add one cup milk slowly, stirring until creamy. Then add one slightly-beaten egg yolk and one 7-ounce can flaked codfish. Season to taste, and heat thoroughly. Cut tops off four baked potatoes, and scoop out centers. Fill jackets with creamed fish, and make the potato into cakes. Serves four.*

**H. J. R. No. 26.
PROPOSING A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON NOVEMBER 8, 1932**

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Article VI of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto Section 3a, which shall read as follows:

"Sec. 3a. When an election is held by any county, or any number of counties, or any political subdivision of the State, or any political subdivision of a county, or any defined district now or hereafter to be described and defined within the State and which may or may not include towns, villages or municipal corporations, or any city, town or village, for the purpose of issuing bonds or otherwise lending credit, or expending money or assuming any debt, only qualified electors who own taxable property in the State, county, political subdivision, district, city town or village where such election is held, and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be qualified to vote and all electors shall vote in the election precinct of their residence."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional amendment shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1932.

**H. J. R. No. 21.
PROPOSING A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON NOVEMBER 8, 1932**

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 14 of Article 8 of the Constitution of Texas be amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

"Section 14. There shall be elected by the qualified electors of each county at the same time and under the same law regulating the election of State and County officers, an Assessor and Collector of Taxes, who shall hold his office, for two (2) years and until his successor is elected and qualified; and such Assessor and Collector of Taxes shall perform all the duties with respect to assessing property for the purpose of taxation and of collecting taxes as may be prescribed by the Legislature."

Sec. 2. That Section 16, of Article 8, of the Constitution of Texas be so amended as to hereafter read as follows:

"Section 16. The sheriff of each county in addition to his other duties shall be the Assessor and Collector of Taxes therefor; but, in counties having ten thousand (10,000) or more inhabitants, to be determined by the last preceding census of the United States, an Assessor and Collector of Taxes shall be elected to hold office for two (2) years and until his successor shall be elected and qualified."

Sec. 3. The foregoing Constitutional amendment shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State on the next general election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1932.

**H. J. R. No. 1.
PROPOSING A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON DECEMBER 8, 1932**

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Article 6 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended so as to read as follows:

"Section 1. The following classes of persons shall not be allowed to vote in this State, to-wit:

First: Persons under twenty-one (21) years of age.

Second: Idiots and Lunatics.

Third: All paupers supported by any county.

Fourth: All persons convicted of any felony, subject to such exceptions as the Legislature may make.

Fifth: All soldiers, marines and seamen, employed in the service of the Army or Navy of the United States. Provided that this restriction shall not apply to officers of the National Guard of Texas, the National Guard Reserves, the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States, nor to enlisted men of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Organized Reserves of the United States, nor to retired officers of the United States Army, Navy and Marine Corps, and retired warrant officers and retired enlisted men of the United States Army, Navy and Marine Corps."

Sec. 2. That Section 33 of Article 33 of Article 10, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended so as to read as follows:

"Section 33. The Accounting Officers of this State shall neither draw

nor pay a warrant upon the Treasury in favor of any person, for salary or compensation as agent, officer or appointee, who holds at the same time any other office or position of honor, trust or profit, under this State or the United States, except as prescribed in this Constitution. Provided, that this restriction as to the drawing and paying of warrants upon the Treasury shall not apply to officers of the National Guard of Texas, the National Guard Reserve, the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States, nor to enlisted men of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Organized Reserves of the United States Army, Navy, and Marine Corps, and retired warrant officers and retired enlisted men of the United States Army, Navy, and Marine Corps."

Sec. 3. That Section 40 of Article 16, of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended so as to read as follows:

"Section 40. No person shall hold or exercise, at the same time, more than one Civil Office of emolument, except that of Justice of Peace, County Commissioner, Notary Public and Postmaster, Officer of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States and enlisted men of the National Guard, the National Guard Reserve, and the Organized Reserves of the United States Army, Navy, and Marine Corps, and retired warrant officers and retired enlisted men of the United States Army, Navy, and Marine Corps, unless otherwise specially provided herein. Provided, that nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to prohibit an officer or enlisted man of the National Guard, and the National Guard Reserve, or an officer in the Officers Reserve Corps of the United States, or an enlisted man in the Organized Reserves of the United States; or retired officers of the United States Army, Navy, and Marine Corps, and retired warrant officers, and retired enlisted men of the United States Army, Navy, and Marine Corps, from holding conjunction with such officer any other office or position of honor, trust or profit, under this State or the United States, or from voting at any Election; General, Special or Primary, in this State when otherwise qualified."

Sec. 4. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State at the next General Election to be held throughout the State on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1932.
