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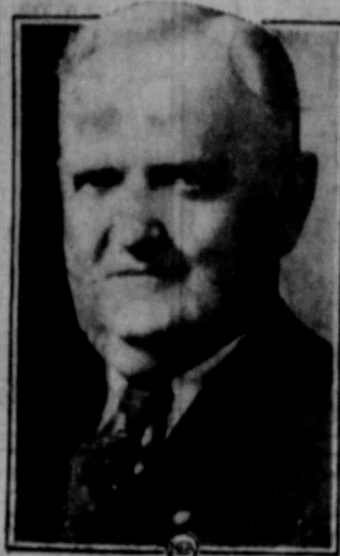

Paris Exhibits Finds of Lost Tribe of Benin

By GABRIEL COURTIAL. United Press Staff Correspondent. PARIS.—The lost tribe of Benin, ancient African dwellers of the 13th century, has been discovered through the ethnological researches of that long deserted region, and objects of art depicting the civilization of a now extinct people are on exhibit in the Ethnological section of the museum of the Trocadero here.

Exhibit First of Series

The exhibition is due largely to M. Ribet, who has been working to launch it ever since his appointment to the directorship of the museum. It is the first of a series of manifestations organized systematically for the purpose of illustrating the different aspects of ethnology and the primitive arts. The ivories and bronzes now on view represent the last vestiges of an ancient region in occidental Africa, whose secular and brilliant civilization disappeared in the last years of the 19th century.

Borrowed From Museums

The art objects which escaped the destruction in the fire which devastated Grand-Benin in 1897 were dispersed for the most part through the museums of Europe from which they have been borrowed.

Importance Inestimable

The importance of these relics of the lost race of Benin cannot be overestimated from an ethnological point of view for each new discovery throws additional light upon a subject that has been wrapped in darkness for the last fifty years. A bloc of volcanic glass carved with signs of the Mexican calendar is the only piece of its kind known in the world today.

Creating an impressive atmosphere

of the ancient region, special phonographic disks are played in the various rooms, reproducing the primitive airs and chants of the people of Benin, and numerous photographs of the country and monuments not in the present collection are an added feature of the exhibition.

The region of Benin is reputed to have been discovered in 1472 by the Portuguese, the earliest historians later writing such marvelous accounts of the size of the streets and the splendor of the city that many explorations were made to see its wonders. Thirty large principal streets are through the town with many smaller ones crossing them at right angles. In 1861 England installed herself at Lagos and organized the massacre of the pacific mission of Consul Philipps which rapidly brought Grand-Benin into submission.

In the palace royal were discovered more than a hundred pieces of sculpture and bronze and ivory works of art, the beauty of which was not even suspected in Europe. Borrowed From Museums. 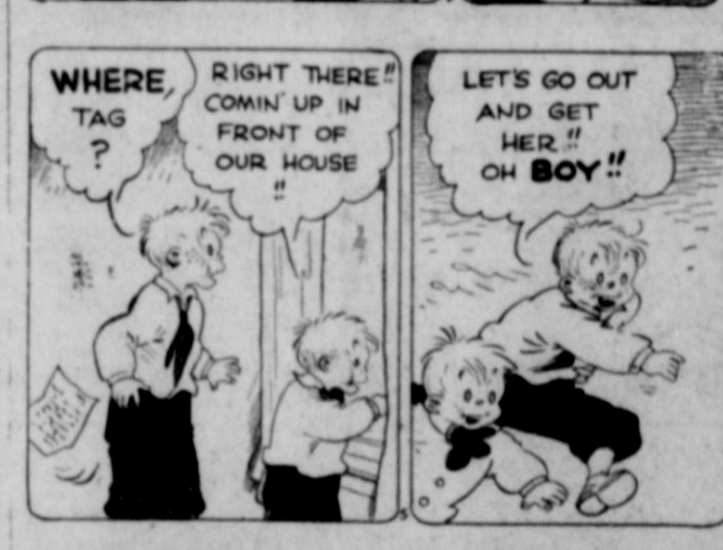

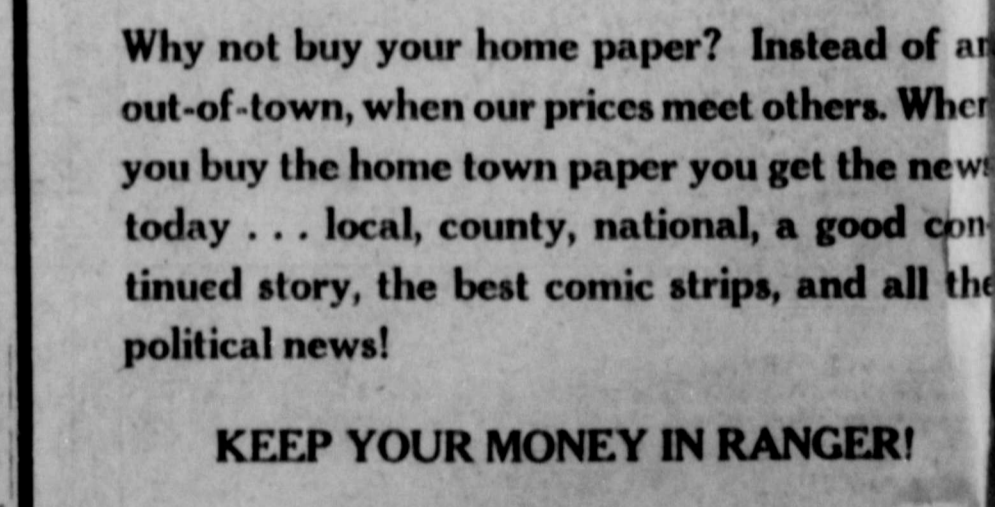
New York State Society Man Is Serving Jail Term
