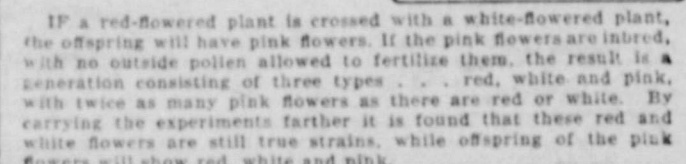

DAILY WASHINGTON LETTER

BY RODNEY DUTCHER, NEA Service Writer. WASHINGTON.—This session of Congress, in which the last lame duck must sing his swan song, will become the most historic—perhaps the most hysterical—as well as the last of the short sessions.

It will bear the angry cries of thousands of militant, unemployed persons and farmers who have struggled toward the capital to protest economic conditions, throwing many Washingtonians into semi-hysteria and causing unprecedented plans for official suppression.

It will make, perhaps ineffectively, the most serious effort thus far toward slashing the huge appropriations for war veterans, now running into a billion dollars a year.

It will make laws in cognizance of the worst winter of depression, unemployment and suffering ever experienced in America, beset by unceasing cries for federal relief of every type.

It will mark the retirement of the last of the famous Republican old guard, whose remnants—principally Senators Reed Smoot of

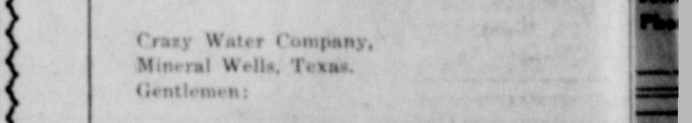

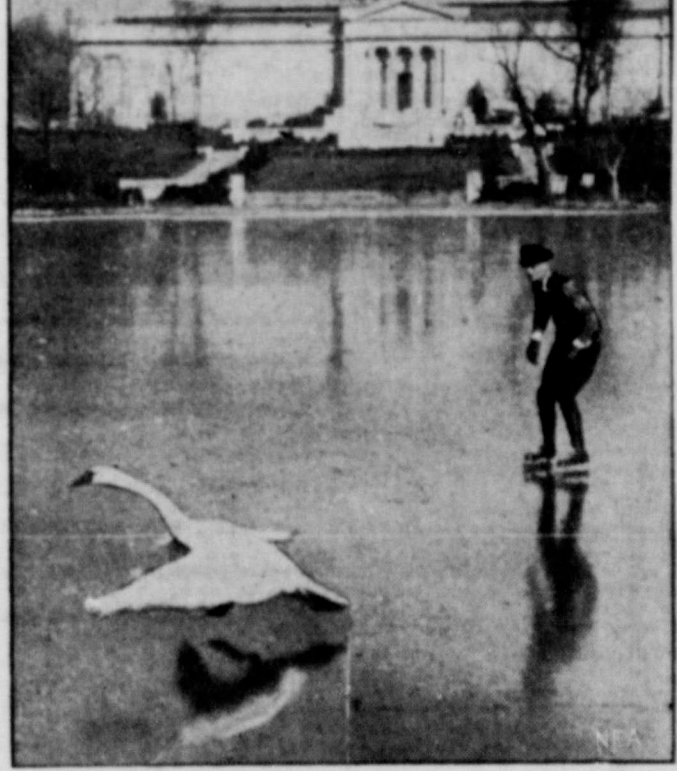

 "THE proof of the pudding" may lie in the eating, but the pudding sauce also is vastly important. While the sauce is secondary to the pudding, nevertheless it can do much to make or mar the dessert.

## Scotch Pressing For Home Rule

LONDON.—Scotland, suffering more acutely from poverty and unemployment than any other of the British Isles, again is pressing its demand for home rule.

Led by the Duke of Mar, the movement is sweeping north with a momentum that threatens to make it one of the biggest domestic issues in Britain.

Since the Union of 1707, Scotland and England have had a common parliament. Since then Scotland has watched her sister nation the empire draw away from her, one by one, establish their own parliaments, and take control of their own cities, foreign and domestic.

The largest, however, is known as the National Party of Scotland, founded four years ago as the result of repeated failure of English-controlled parties to obtain any measure of self-government.

This organization demands a parliament which not only control Scottish affairs, but share with the English parliament the right to direct the whole British Empire.
