## PERMANENT FUND

Texas has a permanent fund of 829,291,007, the latest report of its bursar shows. This includes \$10,000,000 as the estimated worth of 2,000,000 acres of land it owns. The remainder is made up of \$15,767,608 oil and gas royalties; \$1,810,446 bonuses received for oil and gas leases and minor sums. The fund is growing at the rate of \$94,947 a month. That is what it received last month in oil royalles. By state constitution the 29,000,000 fund may not be bent. It is invested in bonds and ily the interest may be used.
