The argument that the legal sale of liquor builds a town has received a telling blow in the Panhandle-Plains region during the past ten years. Example-Amarillo and Lubbock. Amarillo with its numerous liquor establishments building facilities and increased IOOF Lodges at Muleshoe, Littlementioned argument, outstripped Lubbock in population growth and general development. But the census counters didn't see it that way. The bone-dry town on the South Plains has caught, and even since the census count probably passed, the legal liquor city of the Panhandle. By the general rules Amarillo was, and should still be, by far the largest city. Maybe the liquor business even retards growth, something has reversed the order of the big boys of the Plains-Panhandle region. While the people in Amarillo are trying to figure out ways to reduce traffic fatalities in and near their city they might consider the advantage of sober drivers over those that have had one too many. If it were only Amarillo people that were involved in the traffic accidents, that would be their business. But the sad part of the thing it that all too often the thing it that, all too often, the victims are from the neighboring cities that in the past have been responsible for the growth of the Panhandle Metropolis. Considered from that angle it is not only Amarillo's business, but the business of every city and town in the area if the slaughter on the highways continues at the rate it is going.
