Senator Arthur Capper of Kansas appears to be a level headed individual. He has introduced a bill calling for the repeal of the one cent a gallon federal gasoline tax. To be brief and obtain results he passed it on as a rider to the house revenue bill. His argument "Gasoline taxes should be left to the states." On the surface of things it is shown that the sales tax system or method of raising revenue has been left to the states by the federal government. However, as a revenue raising plan it has not been popular with lawmakers of many states although Illinois, the third state in population and wealth, enacted the sales tax as the swiftest method of meeting the deficit in cost of government.
