

## A Homesteading Plan Is Started

GREENBURG, Pa .- The first of 30 homesteading projects authorized by the United States government for Pennsylvania has tarted here.

A 1,327-acre site has been partitioned into two-acre plots for 200 families, each lot to have a four to five room house which, it is estinated, will cost about \$2,500, Seventeen families were assigned

their lots recently, With an appropriation of \$6,-000, a barn in the plot will be remodeled to house a building trades shop where the first 17 homesteaders, all coal miners, and the other 183 will be taught different phases of the building trades, to enable them to aid in furthering

the project in other parts of the In the center of the community is to be established a dairy, eliminating the necessity of any of the homesteaders keeping a cow. A high school is situated near enough to the community for stu-

dents to attend daily classes. Nearly all the houses in the community, under the government's plans, will be of frame con-struction. The \$2,500 estimated cost of each house is to cover all

materials and labor. The homes will be liquidated in 20 to 25 years, under the government's amortization plan, Each of the houses will be of Pennsylvania farm house type. Where possible houses now on the site will be
